Important Information

Parking in Muswell Hill Town Centre

Dear Resident or Trader,

As part of the council's commitment to support local businesses in Haringey, we made several changes to parking in the Muswell Hill area in December 2009. These changes included provision of additional pay and display parking and loading bays. We also increased the time available for parking by removing peak time restrictions; which in turn enabled us to simplify the information displayed on signs.

These measures were introduced in December 2009 under an Experimental Traffic Management Order (TMO), which can remain in place for up to eighteen months. Since its introduction we have received views, comments and representations; all of which we have considered as part of a review to help us decide whether or not the measures should become permanent. A copy of the signed report can be found on our website under Environment & Transport > Parking > Parking consultations > recent parking consultations.

We also received requests from disabled motorists asking for provision of additional disabled bays. In response the Council introduced a further four disabled bays in the area in September 2010. Generally, the improvements have been well received, as there are more parking places available and a longer time period for parking.

Taking all these considerations into account, the Council has decided to make the measures permanent. As the measures are already in place there will be no site works involved, although please note a legal notice was published on 17 March 2011 outlining that the measures will become permanent.
