

# Anti social Behaviour in Haringey Summary Strategy 2008/11

## Methodology

The Anti Social Behaviour Strategy 2005/2008 was updated to reflect the changes in the borough. Discussions were held with all key Partners and colleagues.

**In September 2008** consultation with the public took place at Area Assemblies.

Two questions were asked:

- Do you support the Strategy document in terms of its proposed approach? If not, why?
- Are there any gaps/omissions that you consider ought to be addressed? If so, please give details.

**In October 2008** as part of the ASB Strategy 2009/11 development, we asked residents and partners to identify the key challenges and priorities. These aligned with intelligence gathered from the partnership Strategic Assessments which have been included in our Action Plan priority areas.

## Responses

The responses received were supportive of the Strategy document and its proposed approach.

## Summary of Findings

The Consultation process identified four priorities

- 1. Co-ordinate prevention and early intervention, especially in support of young people.**
  - Strengthening parenting support by assisting families whose members are at significant risk of committing anti social behaviour.
  - Mapping and joining up young peoples services for targeted youth support, looking at assessments, referral pathway, gaps and overlaps
  - Improving outcomes for victims and perpetrators of ASB and those with mental health problems.
- 2. Co-ordinate responses to ASB and problem-solving using the area based working model and joint intelligence**
  - Locally identified ASB issues to be brought into the area based problem solving model.
  - Dealing with the issues facing new communities in the borough
  - Tacking problems relating to alcohol misuse and excess

- Continued improvement in our methods of data capture
- 3. Measurably improving confidence in how the Police and Council deal with ASB**
- Improving communication and public perceptions of ASB and young people
  - Improved working with the voluntary sector
  - ENCAMS Enviro-crime Hotspots Project – local project to be undertaken to and evaluated.
- 4. Continue the strategic use of partnership enforcement tools**
- Promoting self and third party reporting for hate crime and harassment.
  - Tackling ASB across housing tenures and working with RSL's where appropriate concerning their properties

The consultation process with Partners and Stake holders has resulted in the updated ASB Strategy document which identifies the priorities the Council and Partners need to work on for the next two years.
