LORDSHIP REC' WINS FUNDING FOR MAJOR MAKEOVER

Welcome to the second edition of the neighbourhood improvements newsletter for residents of Broadwater Farm and the local area.

In this issue we focus on **Lordship Recreation Ground** which has won £400,000 to help **transform the park**. This follows a successful bid to the London-wide parks competition organised by the Greater London Authority.



Lordship Recreation Ground received the most public votes in the north London region thanks to the Rec's huge support and campaigning by local people.

The money will go towards the 'match funding' which needs to be provided by Haringey Council to make the parks plans become a reality. The project is set to be completed by 2012, and aims to improve the experiences of visitors, and attract more people to the park. The project will include:

- An Environmental Centre and City Farm;
- Restoration of the River Moselle;
- Restoration of the Model Traffic Area; Shell Theatre and BMX Track

The Council is working with the Lordship Rec' Users Forum and others to develop the project. A planning application will be submitted shortly. For details contact Luisa Baker - 0208 489 1868.

Work on a separately funded project to improve the **playground** and create modern play equipment for young children starts in May.

Inclusive Learning Campus - *Update*

Work is continuing to develop designs for an Inclusive Learning Campus. Broadwater Farm Primary, William C Harvey and Moselle special schools will be part of a new educational building, along with the Children's Centre. Architects are currently working with the schools and the Council to develop detailed designs showing what the inclusive learning campus could look like. These ideas will be shared with pupils, parents and local community in the months ahead.

The ambitious plans for a new learning campus at Broadwater Farm is part of Haringey Council's primary and pre-school (PPS) programme. The aim is to improve opportunities for children aged up to 11 years.

INCLUSIVE LEARNING CAMPUS AT A GLANCE

The new campus will feature:

- A 100 place special school formed by the primary departments of William C Harvey and Moselle special schools
- A two-form entry primary school
- A 100 place children's centre
- It is anticipated that the campus will open in 2012.
