A new inclusive learning campus

The transformation taking place at **Woodside High School** is an illustration of how BSF investment can help ensure that inclusion is part of the fabric of a school environment.

Woodside High School's new Inclusive Learning Campus represents the second largest project in our programme. The school will support students of all abilities and will be fully accessible to students with mobility and physical difficulties. The campus will bring together students from Woodside High and pupils from a new special school created from the upper schools of Moselle School and William C Harvey School.

New and refurbished sections of the school are completely accessible, with lifts and step free access. Areas are clearly zoned with stairwells in bright colour marking where you are in the building; each floor is coded to aide students. The whole ethos of the school is to create a truly

inclusive environment that is equally valuable to all.

Students on the campus will have a range of disabilities and will have a social zone with computer and technology spaces so that they have the opportunity to learn in different settings. The sensory rooms will be located close to this area.
