

## Feedback from Consultation

### Central Leaside Area Action Plan Issues and Options

Purpose of consultation:	<p>The primary purpose of the Central Leaside Area Action Plan (CLAAP) Issues and Options report is to evaluate the characteristics of and pressures facing the Central Leaside business area and develop a planning framework for development and regeneration.</p> <p>There is a need to develop a coherent vision and strategic framework for the area in order to ensure that it can respond positively to future demands. Enfield and Haringey councils are working together on this project. Central Leaside is the collective name given to the employment areas that lie on the border between the London Boroughs of Enfield and Haringey.</p> <p>Central Leaside Area Action Plan includes the part of Northumberland Park Ward covering the Brantwood, Marsh Lane, North East Tottenham and the Willoughby Lane employment areas.</p> <p>The Issues and Options report represents the first of 3 stages of consultation. At this stage views were specifically sought on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ The objectives</li> <li>▪ The options to tackle the issues facing the area</li> <li>▪ Any objectives, issues and options that we have missed</li> </ul> <p>The information is used to develop preferred options for the area which will be subject to another level of consultation early 2009.</p>
Methodology:	<p>LB Enfield is the body responsible for the overall consultation, and the consultation is carried out according to measures identified in the Statement of Community Involvement for both boroughs. The consultation was publicised through the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Letters and summary leaflets were sent to statutory consultees and those on the consultation database</li> <li>▪ Copies of the strategy were sent to statutory bodies</li> <li>▪ Publicising consultation and providing full documents in</li> </ul>

	<p>Enfield and Haringey webpages</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Limehouse software was used by Enfield to allow people to answer questions at various stages of the strategy online.</li> <li>▪ Exhibitions for businesses and residents including one in Northumberland Park and Pickets Lock Athletics Stadium</li> <li>▪ Press releases</li> </ul>
Findings:	Over 40 responses were received with a large number of separate comments about the content of the strategy. These will be analysed and inform the preferred options document.
What does this mean for us?	The comments will be used to inform a second 'preferred options' document for Central Leaside which will be consulted on early 2009.
