Statutory Notification

Options for traffic management in the Blake Road and Bidwell Gardens area of Bounds Green

Dear Resident or Trader,

Since 2005 Haringey Council, working in partnership with Enfield Council and Transport for London (TfL), have completed five traffic management projects to improve the residential environment in several neighbourhoods bordering, or close to, the A406 North Circular Road.

We now seek your views on two options for traffic management and calming in the Bounds Green area centred on Blake Road and Bidwell Gardens. The area is bounded by Middlesex University in the North, and Durnsford Road in the South. The options provide two alternative sets of measures designed to address three issues of concern to residents and traders in this area, namely:

- Use of several roads as cut-throughs or as more commonly described: 'rat-runs'
- Excessive vehicle speeds
- Lack of facilities for pedestrians

The options have been developed as a result of liaison between the Council and a focus group of local residents and ward councillors. Five focus group meetings were held during which two designs were prepared and are presented in the attached booklet for your consideration.

This notification letter marks the start of a consultation period in which we invite you to tell us what you think about the options set out in the attached leaflet. To 'have your say' please complete the questionnaire in the attached booklet and return it to us using the Freepost envelope which is also provided.

Please return your completed questionnaire as soon as possible and no later than **17 December 2010**. Your views will ensure we deliver the right scheme for your area.
