

Supply of childcare for children over the age of 5

This section provides a summary of the supply of childcare for children aged 5 and over in Haringey. An audit on childcare provision for over 5s was conducted in December 2007 by the Children & Young People's service. The figures in this section are based on responses to that audit.

Definitions of childcare

Out of school care: Facilities that provide day care for children over five years old which operate during one or more of the following periods:

- before school;
- after school;
- during the school holidays.

The information on after school provision is broken down to distinguish between activities provided by schools (i.e. dance, football and art classes) and secure after school club provision which operates from 3pm - 6pm

The types of provision that are analysed in this section are breakfast clubs and after school clubs that are provided by Phase 1 children's centres, PVI's special schools and primary schools. Secondary schools have not been included in the data analysis. However, there is information about the number of secondary schools offering breakfast and/or after school club provision which can be found at the end of this section.

Location of childcare providers

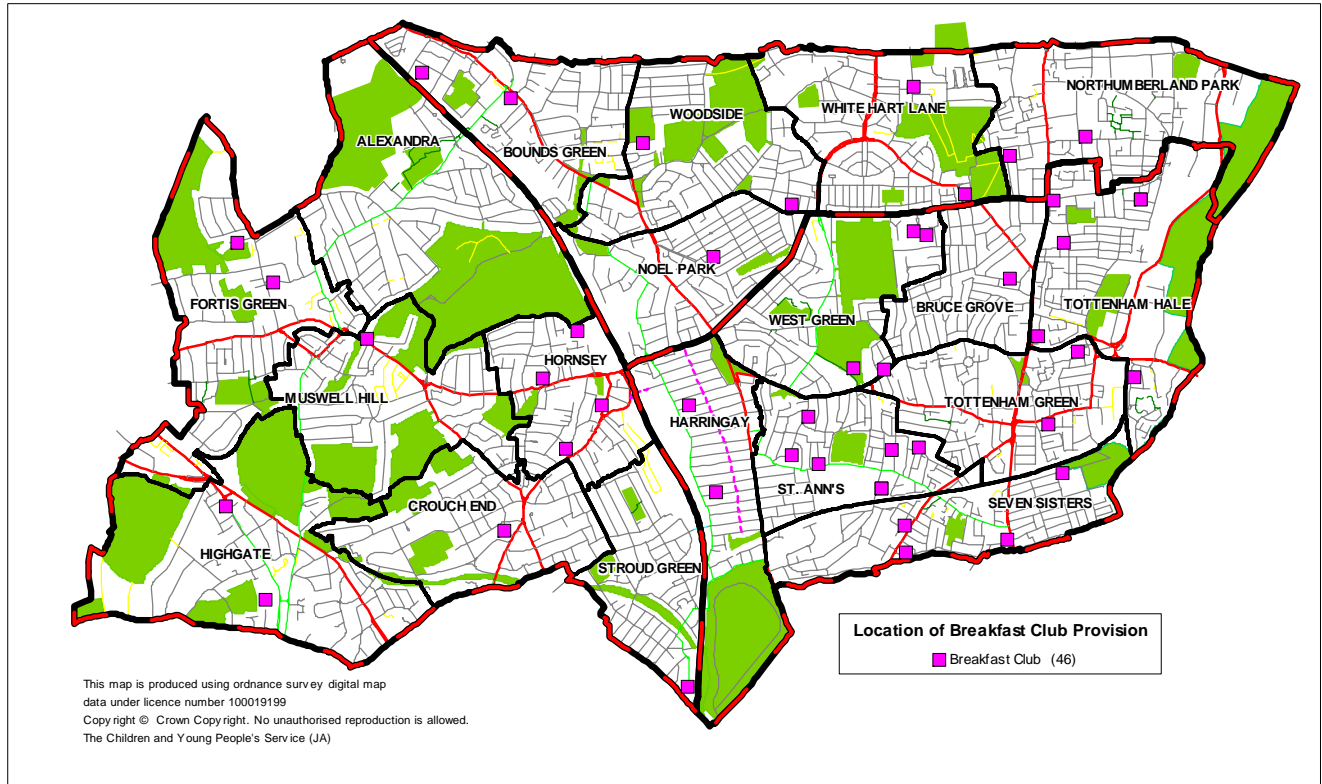
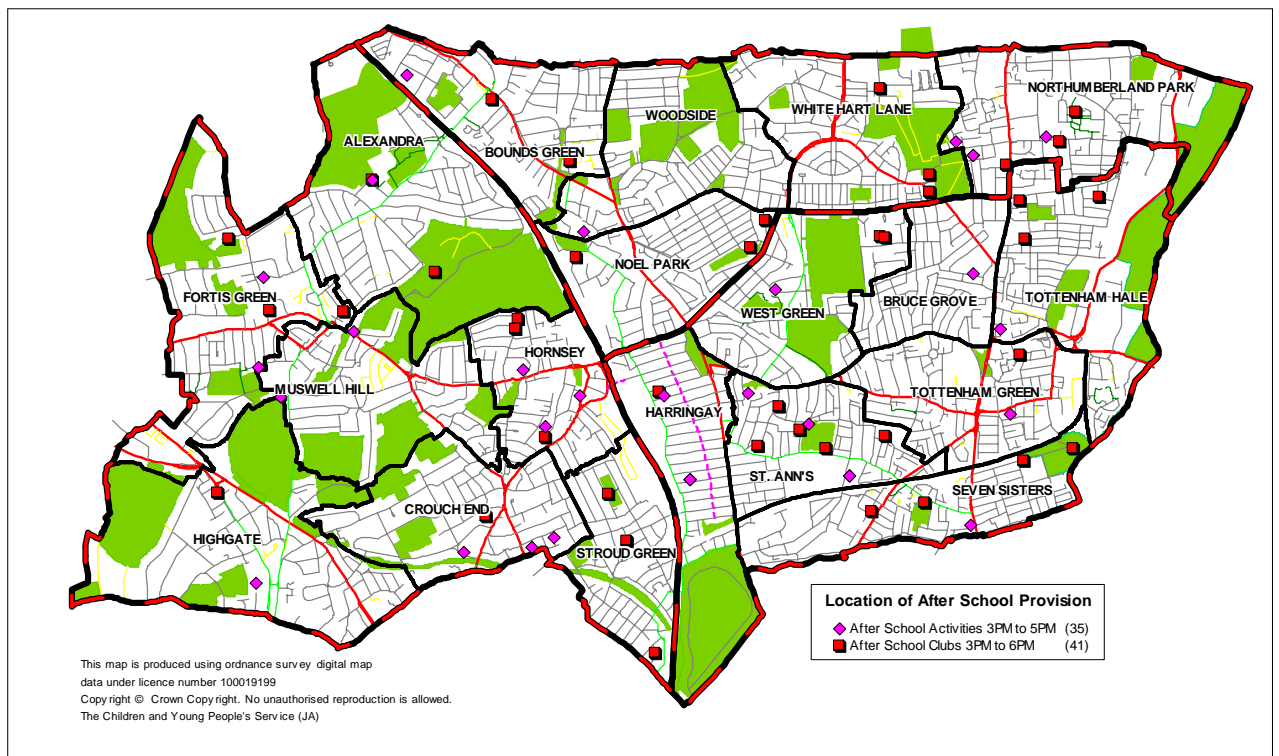


Figure 46: location of after school clubs.

There are 46 providers of breakfast clubs and 75 providers of after school club provision, of which 34 comprise of after school activities. Figures 45 & 46 show the location of breakfast and after school clubs for children over the age of 5.

Figure 45 : location of breakfast club providers.

Number of places

Figure 47 shows that there are a total of 1,639 breakfast school club places and 2,321 after school places, of which 955 comprise of after school activities.

There is a noticeable variation at ward level in the number of before and after school club places available. For example, Tottenham Hale (255) and St Ann's wards (250) have the highest number of breakfast club places whilst Alexandra has no breakfast club provision. The wards with the highest number of after school clubs places are St Ann's (255), Hornsey (150) and Seven Sisters (117). Bruce Grove and Woodside have no after school clubs.

Figure 49: number of breakfast club places.

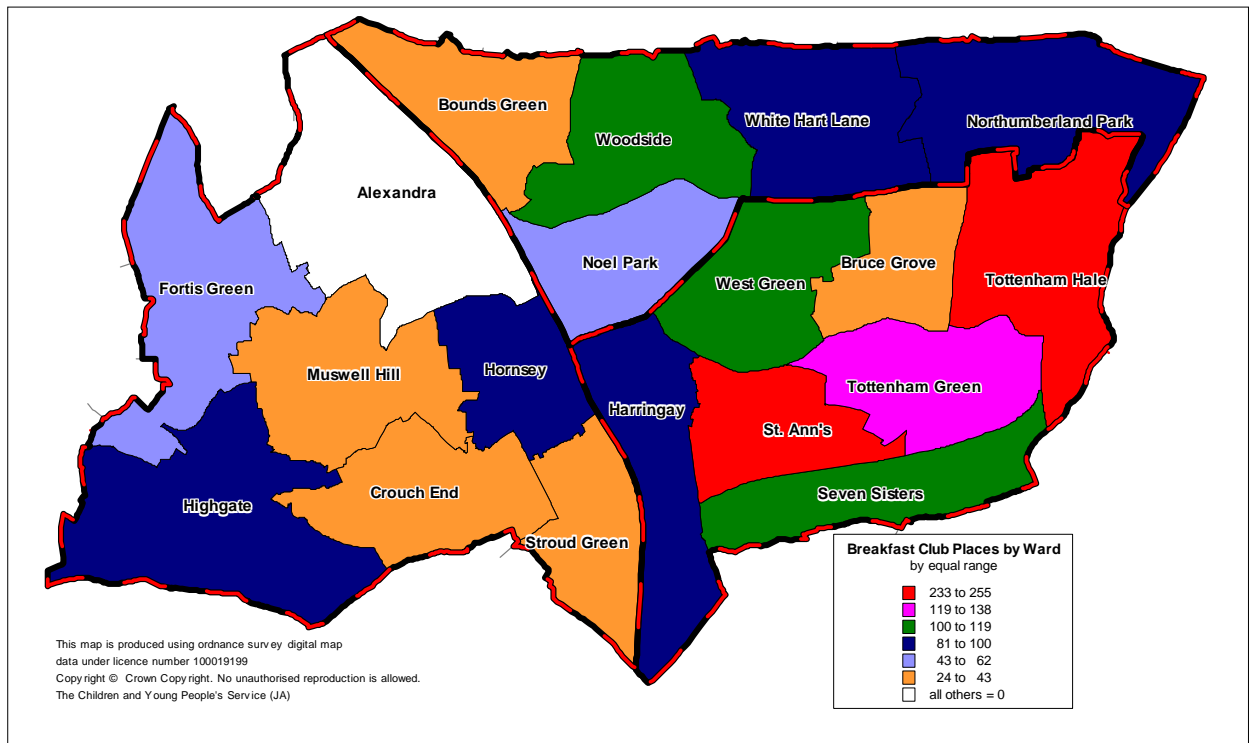


Figure 50: number of after school club places from 3pm-5pm.

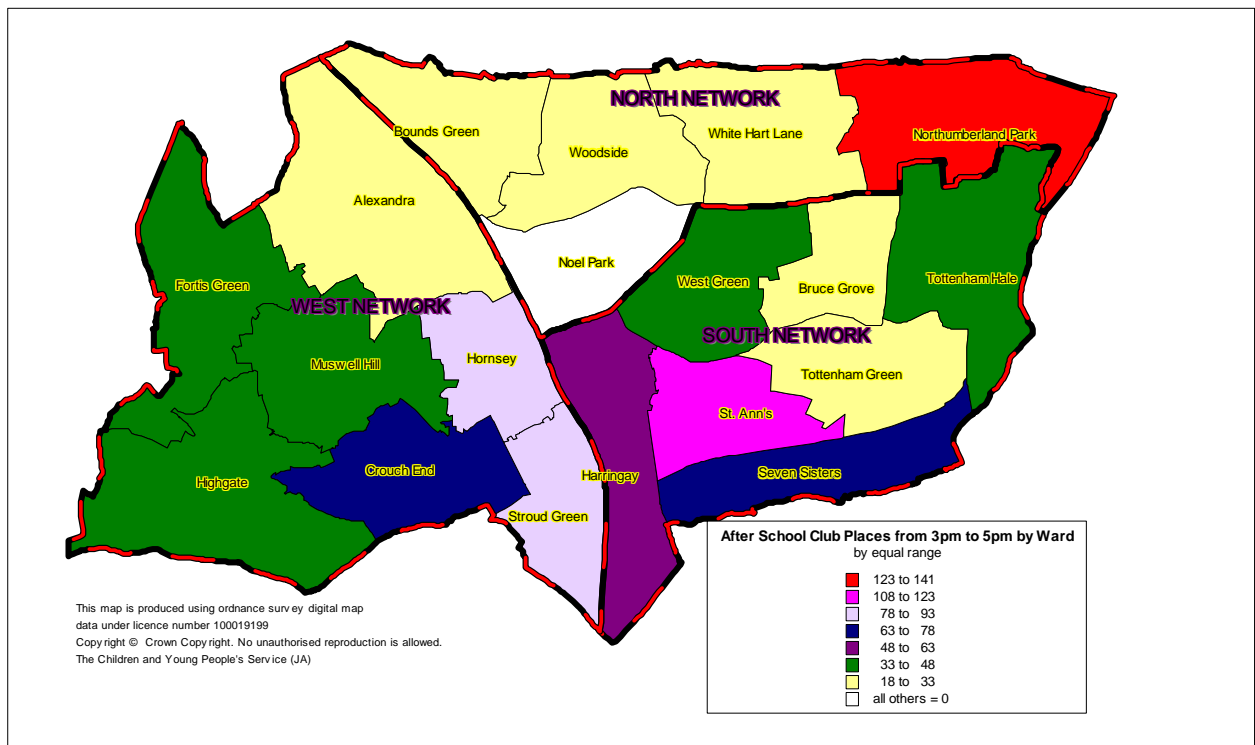
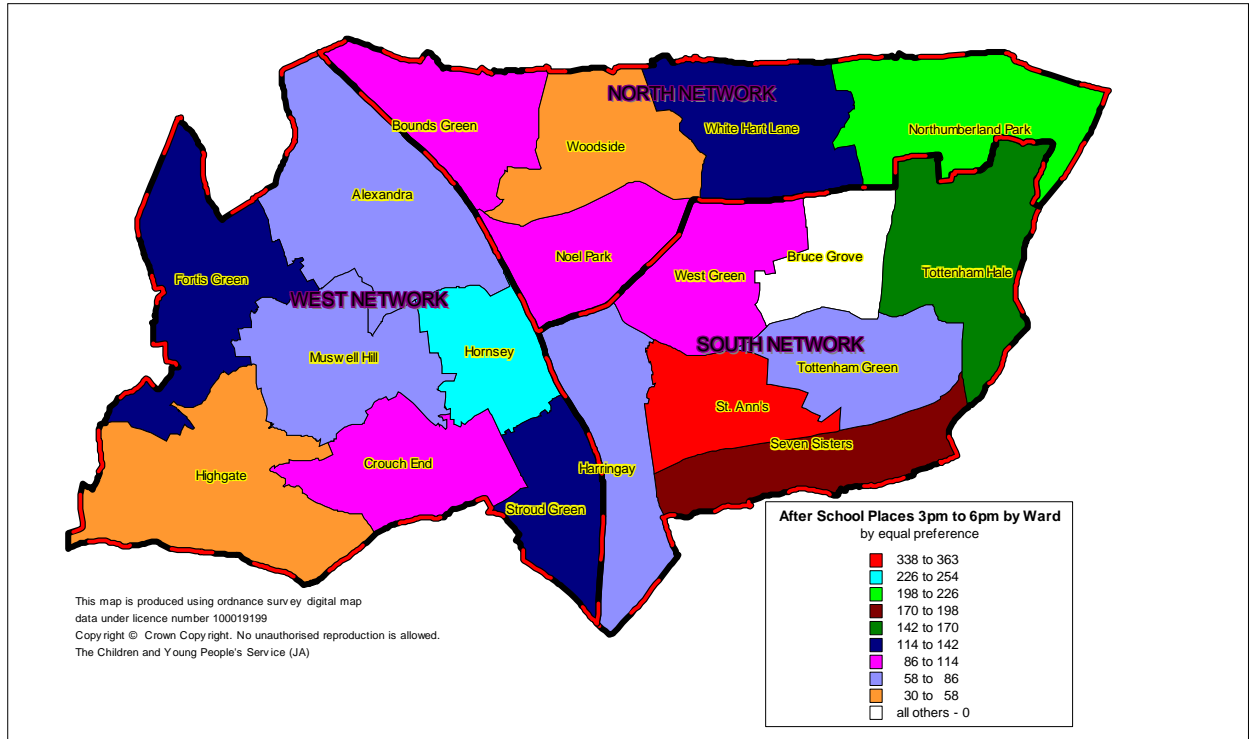


Figure 51: number of after school club places from 3pm-6pm.



Figures 52 and 53 show the number of places by provider type. The data shows that the majority of breakfast clubs are run by primary schools. For after school clubs, the PVI group settings and Play Service make up 48% of total places. Five primary schools provide after school care from 3pm - 6pm.

Opening times

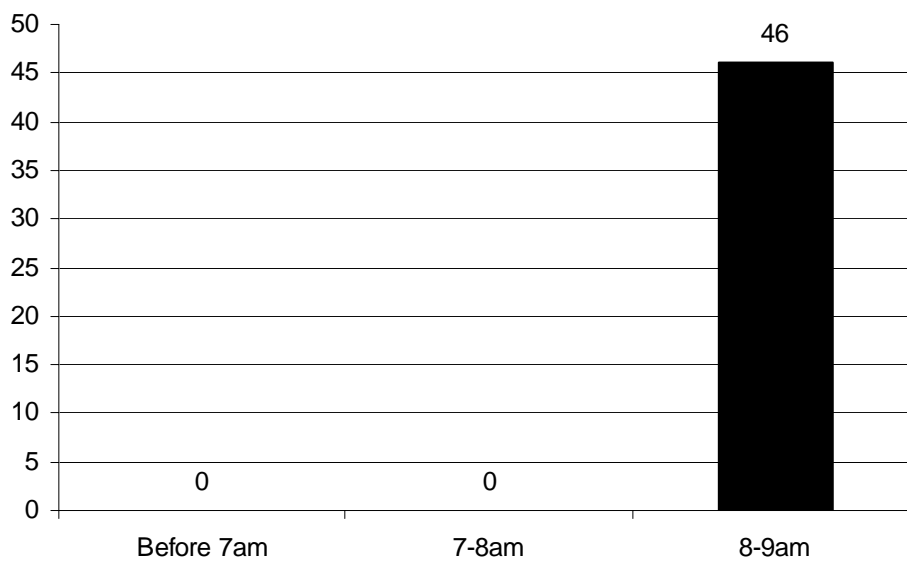


Figure 55: number of places in breakfast clubs opened at specified times.

Figures 54 and 55 show whether a provider is open at any point during the time period specified, i.e. if a provider opens at 8.15am until 8.45am they will have been classified as being opened between 8am-9am.

Breakfast clubs

Figures 54 to 56 show that across Haringey there are no providers or places offering breakfast clubs before 7am or from 7am - 8am. All 46 breakfast clubs are open between 8am – 9am offering a total of 1,639 places.

Figure 54: number of breakfast club providers opened at specified times.

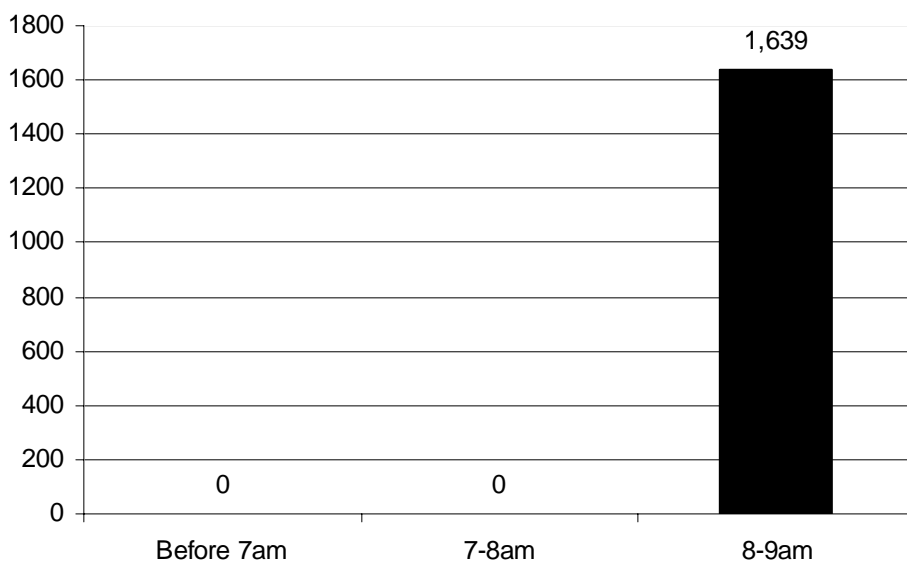


Figure 56: number of breakfast club providers, places and opening times by ward.

After school clubs

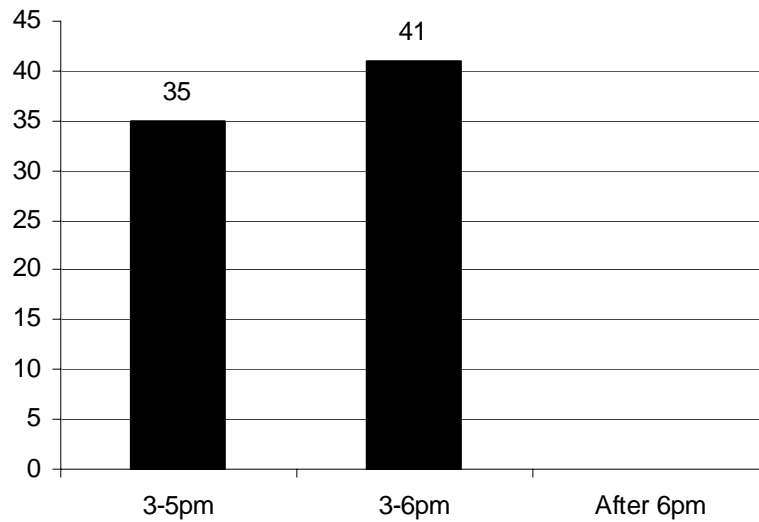


Figure 58: number of places in after school clubs open at specified times.

Figure 57 and 58 shows that there are 41 providers open between 3pm and 6pm providing 1,366 places. Please note that four out of 41 providers finish at 6.15pm and four out of 41 providers close at 6.30pm. This has not been captured by the graph as these providers have been listed in the 3pm-6pm category.

Figure 57: number of after school providers open from specified times.

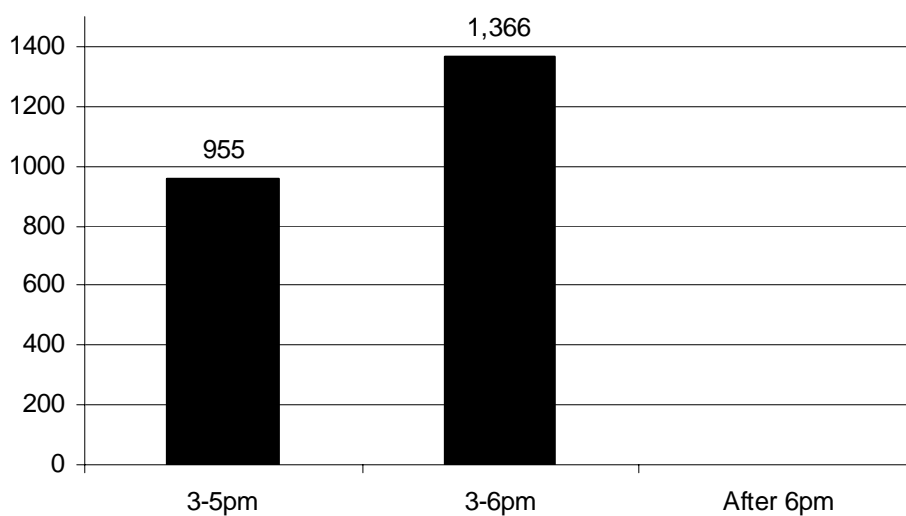


Figure 59: number of after school activity providers open between 3pm-5pm.

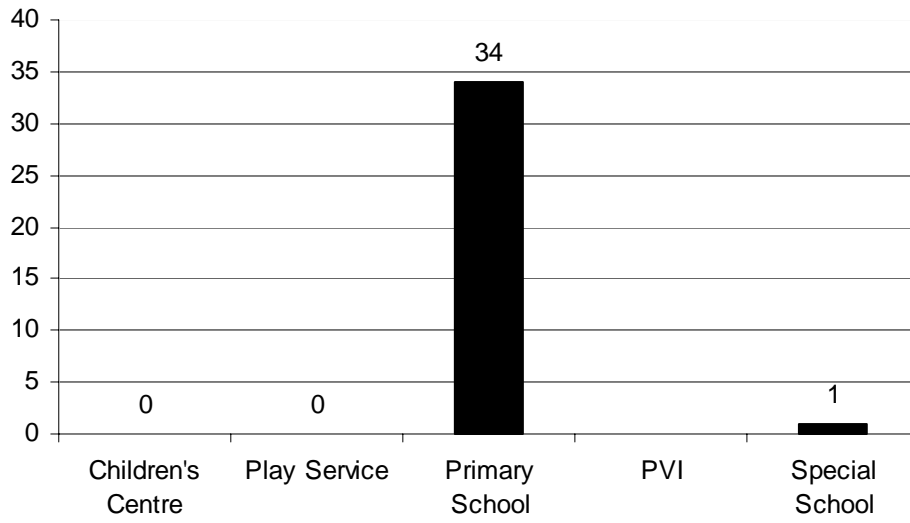


Figure 60: number of after school club providers open between 3pm - 6pm.

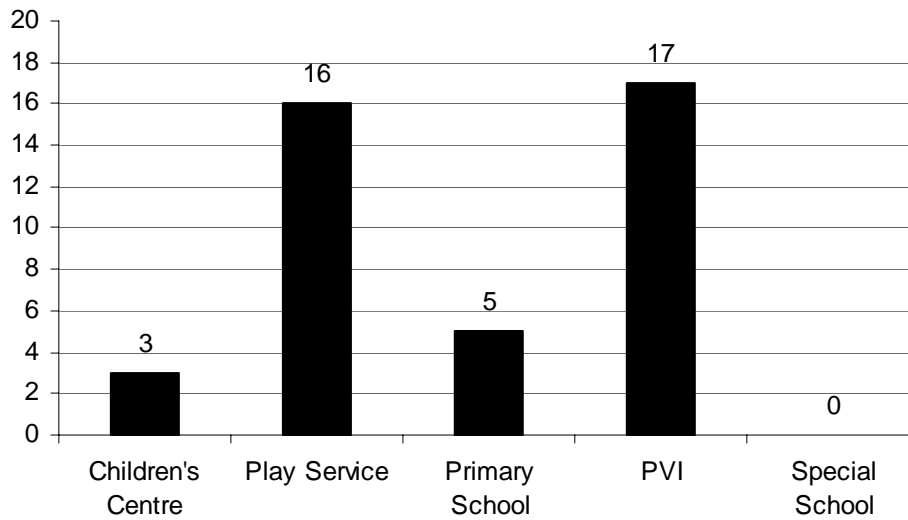


Figure 61: number of after school activity and club providers, places by ward.

Vacancies

The table below shows the number of providers with vacancies and the number of vacancies in breakfast clubs and after school clubs. It shows that across Haringey there are 20 breakfast clubs with vacancies and 32 after school club with vacancies. The wards with the highest number of breakfast club vacancies are Woodside (60) and Tottenham Hale (55) and for after school club vacancies, St Ann's (78) and White Hart Lane (30).

Fees

Figure 63 shows the average daily and weekly fees for breakfast clubs and after school clubs in Haringey. The average weekly cost for after school clubs is £39.20 and £8.30 for breakfast clubs. This equates to £1.20 per day for breakfast clubs and £6.70 per day for after school clubs.

There is a noticeable difference at ward level. The average weekly cost of breakfast clubs ranges from £1.90 in Woodside to £25 per week in Crouch End and Stroud Green. The average weekly cost of after school clubs ranges from £13.50 in Highgate to £50 in Crouch End. Crouch End and Stroud Green wards have the most expensive breakfast clubs. Crouch End, St. Ann's and Tottenham Hale wards have the most expensive after school clubs.

Secondary schools

There are 11 secondary schools in Haringey, five of which provide a breakfast club service where the pupils can eat breakfast from the hours of 8am - 8.30am, with the exception of one school which opens from 7.45am. The number of pupils that attend this resource ranges from 50 - 200. There is one secondary school which provides sports activities for its pupils from 7.40am - 8.30am. All secondary schools in Haringey provide a varied menu of activities for their students after school, such as homework, sports and arts clubs.

Holiday play schemes

Figure 65 shows that in 2007 there were 40 holiday play schemes offering 1,435 places across Haringey. The wards with the highest number of providers of holiday play schemes were in Stroud Green (5) and Seven Sisters (5) wards. Alexandra, Bounds Green, Highgate and Woodside wards had no holiday play scheme provision. There were 22 PVI group settings providers and 18 Maintained providers of holiday play schemes in 2007.
