Open Places

Eden Primary is a Jewish school that welcomes both Jewish and non-Jewish children.

15 places will be offered to children whose parents or carers have chosen the school, whether they practice Judaism or not, in the following order of priority:

1. Children who are in the care of a Local Authority as per section 22 of the Children Act 1989.
2. Children whose social or medical needs are needs that the School can reasonably meet and which are such that they cannot be met sufficiently at another school.
3. Children with a sibling on the roll of the school at the time of the proposed admission.
4. Children living nearest to the school as measured in a straight line from the child's front door to the main entrance of the school.

Faith-based places

15 places will be offered to children of families practising an aspect of Judaism. These faith-based places will be allocated in the same order of priority as open places (see above).

1. Catholic looked after children.
2. Practising Catholics who are resident in the parish of Our Lady of Muswell.
3. Practising Catholics who are not resident in the parish of Our Lady of Muswell.

Exceptional need

Governors will give top priority within a category to applicants where the evidence for the exceptional needs is compelling. To demonstrate an exceptional social, medical, educational or pastoral need of the child which can only be met at this school, the governing body will require written evidence submitted to the school at the time of application from an appropriate professional, such as a social worker, doctor or priest.

Siblings and multiple births

Within each of the above criteria, priority will be given to children who will have a sibling in the school at the time of admission.

In the case of multiple births, separate forms and accompanying documents must be supplied for each child. Where only one place is available for more than one child in the same family, the offer of the place will be decided by lottery which will be carried out by governors in the presence of an independent witness.

Tie break

As a tie-breaker within any of the criteria, precedence will be given to children living nearer to the school measured in a straight line from the child's front door (home address) to the main front door of the school. The address used to determine distance from the school is the residence up to the time of the Governors' Admissions Meeting.

Definitions

Catholic: a member of a Church in full communion with the See of Rome. This includes Eastern Catholic Churches. This will normally be evidenced by a certificate of baptism in a Catholic Church or a certificate of reception into the full communion of the Catholic Church.

Practising Catholic: this term means a Catholic child from a practising Catholic family where this practice is verified by a reference from a Catholic priest in the standard format laid down by the Diocese.

Resident: within the Parish boundary of Our Lady of Muswell, as shown on the parish map held in the parish presbytery. The address used to apply should be the address at which the child resides for 50% or more of the school week and Haringey's Children's Services will check that the information given is correct. If it is found that a place was offered to a child on the basis of false information supplied by a parent or guardian the Children's Service reserve the right to withdraw the place.

Sibling: this includes brothers and sisters, foster brothers and sisters, half brothers and half sisters or stepbrothers and sisters. It does not include other relations. The sibling must reside at the same address as the child applying for a place. Whether a sibling attends the school refers to the admissions year, not the current school year.

(Please note: If the only sibling is currently in Year 6 the sibling preference will not apply for the following academic year.)

Eastern Christian: includes Orthodox Churches and is normally evidenced by a certificate of baptism or reception from the authorities of that church.

Where the offer of places to all the applicants in any of the categories listed above would still lead to oversubscription, the places up to the admissions number will be offered to those living nearest to the school.
