## Statutory Notification

### Raised Zebra Crossing on Western Road N22

Dear Resident or Trader,

I am pleased to inform you that the Council has secured funding as part of 'Building Schools for the Future' project, to improve safety in the vicinity of Heartlands School.

We propose to construct a raised pedestrian crossing and to reduce the road width by building out the pavement. The raised crossing will reduce the speed of approaching traffic and provide a quicker, safer and step-free crossing point for pedestrians. Reducing the carriageway width will also improve pedestrian accessibility by minimizing the crossing distance and improving visibility.

Specifically the work will consist of:

- Introducing a raised pedestrian crossing on Western Road near to the mini roundabout on Mayes Road.
- Building out the footway on the north side of the Zebra Crossing.
- Providing anti-skid surfacing on the approach to the Zebra Crossing.
- Renewing worn-out road marking in the vicinity of the site

Full details are set out in the plan overleaf. This notification letter marks the start of a three-week statutory notification period during which we welcome comments and representations by email to [Frontline.consultation@haringey.gov.uk](mailto:Frontline.consultation@haringey.gov.uk) Alternatively you can call our Project Engineer Paul Miles on 0208 489 1717 or you can write to us at the address above. Please ensure that your comments reach us no later than 03/11/2011.

If no major objections are received, we plan to start the work on 14/11/2011 and expect it will be completed within four weeks - weather permitting. We will make every effort to minimise inconvenience while the work is in progress.
