

# Safer for All

Strategy Summary 2008-2011

What it means for you

In this document, we have summarised the priorities and main areas of activity agreed by the Safer Communities Partnership for the coming three years in consultation with local people. This work rests on many years of collaboration and consultation which have given us a better understanding of the causes of crime and the impact of our interventions.

The trend for recorded crime in Haringey has fallen by 22% since 2003 and concern about crime in the borough fell recently from 54% to 46% – its lowest level since 2000. The number of local people benefiting from drug treatment services, domestic violence support and action by our Anti-Social Behaviour Team is higher than ever. Police Safer Neighbourhood Teams are well established in all wards and are working well with locally based Council services. We are happy to report a high level of public satisfaction with this model.

We recognise, however, that we still have many challenges and new ones will inevitably appear. We also know that many crimes go unreported and improving confidence will be a priority. Achieving positive outcomes in the longer run for young people at risk and those resettling in the community is a shared vision in this strategy. We have also

reconfirmed our commitment to prevention and early intervention along with a balanced and proportionate approach to enforcement.

As always, we will need continued public support and co-operation to find better solutions to problems at the neighbourhood level and achieve a higher rate of success. The Safer Haringey Partnership is responsible for six key priorities and we will work together to ensure that our approach is co-ordinated and targeted.

#### OUR PRIORITY

### Young people – Prevention and support

What we will do:

- We will continue to invest in youth activity and diversion projects which have proven outcomes. These will include the Local Intervention Fire Education project run by the London Fire Brigade – an intensive programme helping young people to understand the role of fire fighters and the consequences of deliberate fire setting
- We will continue the highly successful Youth Action Challenge, where young people develop creative solutions to tackling crime and anti-social behaviour in Haringey, with the help of a business mentor

- We will provide joint leadership to the Youth Summit, increasing safety and the use of restorative approaches in schools, mediation and mentoring.

#### OUR PRIORITY

### Serious crime – Violence, acquisitive crime and domestic violence

What we will do:

- We will continue with targeted crime prevention publicity campaigns, in particular with respect to motor vehicle crime and burglary. These may include: portable posters and a 'posters on wheels' van with crime prevention messages for use in hotspots; and stickers on pay and display machines reminding vehicle owners to keep their belongings out of sight
- We will commission and support early intervention projects regarding weapons

- We will continue to support organisations that provide services to victims of burglary, with a special focus on repeat victims and older people
- We will improve the quality, co-ordination and effectiveness of services for domestic violence survivors and ensure that they are safe and supported. We will reduce the tolerance of domestic violence in local communities and hold abusers to account.

## OUR PRIORITY

**Anti-social behaviour –  
A focus on children and  
families, housing and public  
spaces**

What we will do:

- We will focus efforts on young people and supporting families where there is a significant risk of members becoming perpetrators

- We will continue to improve the cleanliness of the borough and deliver a programme of work addressing environmental crime
- We will tackle anti-social behaviour with all of our housing partners.

## OUR PRIORITY

**Drugs and alcohol –  
Prevention and effective  
treatment**

What we will do:

- We will target services more successfully and prioritise drug treatment programmes
- We will identify the best way of delivering services that address all the needs of the person
- We will work together to reduce the harm caused by alcohol excess and misuse.

OUR PRIORITY

**Reducing re-offending –  
Adults and young people**

What we will do:

- We will support ex-offenders into sustainable employment, training or apprenticeship through the Haringey Guarantee and Worklessness Programme
- We will adapt the London Resettlement Project locally in Haringey and join up the existing work for both adults and young people.

OUR PRIORITY

**Increasing confidence across  
the Criminal Justice System**

What we will do:

- We will improve partnership working between key public-facing groups and services such as Victim Support, Hearthstone, Safer Neighbourhood Teams and community mental health teams

- We will support and monitor the impact of the Community Justice Court Pilot, ensuring that sentences reflect the concerns of the local community and repair the damage caused to those communities.

In order to meet our priorities we will adopt and build on a number of working practices:

- We will use multi-disciplinary approaches, ensuring that all our efforts are co-ordinated across relevant agencies. This will help produce sustainable change and avoid duplication of work
- We will use structured techniques to find solutions to complex problems, and we will carry out a thorough evaluation of all the projects we undertake
- We will continue to combine community intelligence with robust data and analysis to produce an annual strategic assessment as a driver for planning and allocating resources
- We will put residents' needs at the core of our approach, raising awareness of the different ways for reporting crime and anti-social behaviour. We will address the gap between residents' perceptions about crime and the actual situation through closer and more targeted engagement
- We will manage a programme of emergency planning and business continuity, developing community resilience and preparation
- We will prioritise a programme of joint communication and reassurance
- We will continue to engage with our communities and survivors of crime to inform and shape our priorities
- We will continue to promote equalities, diversity and community cohesion.
