School Standards and Inclusion Service

The **School Improvement and Inclusion Service** offers advice and support to all Haringey schools for school improvement. The dedicated team for Supporting School Improvement (SSI) will design the support to meet your individual requirements. This could be support for management, curriculum advice, or assistance with teaching and learning. This service is offered in addition to the statutory functions of the Local Authority in respect of raising achievement in Haringey schools.

The SSI has a team of experienced staff with local knowledge and understanding who are committed to supporting Haringey schools. They aim to support you in tackling the particular challenges you face in your school, and as part of your individual support package they can engage external consultants with specific curriculum and leadership expertise.

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Haringey Healthy Schools Programme

The **Healthy Schools Team**, alongside its partner agencies, offers advice and support to all schools participating in the **Haringey Healthy Schools Programme**. This includes supporting schools in the self-assessment process and helping them to identify areas for development to assist them in meeting the National Healthy School Standard themes of PSHE (Personal Social and Health Education), Healthy Eating, Physical Activity and Emotional Health and Wellbeing.
