

Feedback from Statutory Consultation

Review of Seven Sisters CPZ and proposed Bruce Grove CPZ

Purpose of consultation :	<p>To allow interested parties to comment on proposals to introduce the Bruce Grove CPZ and change the existing Seven Sisters CPZ according to statutory requirements.</p> <p>Statutory consultation is a legal process, where a notice informing of the council's intentions must be published in a local and national newspaper, providing a 21-day period for interested parties to comment.</p>
Methodology:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 3,500 letters indicating that there will be no change to the operating hours of the existing CPZ (Monday-Saturday 8am-6.30pm) were distributed to the existing CPZ area. • 2,000 leaflets were distributed to that part of the surrounding area where it is proposed to extend the Seven Sisters CPZ. The proposed extension is to be called the Bruce Grove CPZ and will operate Monday-Saturday 8am-6.30pm. • Notices were placed in the London Gazette and local press, on lamp columns and on the council website • Interested parties have had the opportunity to view the plans and discuss the proposals in person by making an appointment with council officers. • Leaflets sent to the following statutory bodies: AA, London Transport, Police (local), Fire Brigade, London Ambulance Service, Freight Transport Association, Road Haulage Association, RAC, Metropolitan Police (Traffic), Haringey Cycling Campaign and Haringey Accord. <p>58 responses were received during the 21-day statutory period. This represents a 1% response rate.</p>
Findings:	<p>Of the 58 representations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two were received from the existing Seven Sisters CPZ • Forty-one were received from the proposed Bruce Grove CPZ area. • Thirteen were received from outside the CPZ area • Two were received from ward councillors on behalf of residents. <p>The feedback was as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Forty-two representations in the form of a standard letter objecting to the proposals on various grounds. • Eight individual representations objecting to the proposals. • Four individual representations in support of the proposals. • One individual representation requesting clearer signage in the existing CPZ • Two individual representations asking that St Margaret's and St Loy's Road be included in the proposed Bruce Grove CPZ. • One representation from a ward councillor highlighting

	the need for the travellers in Clyde Road to be allowed to use large vehicles.
How were results communicated?	Consultation results published on the council website. Leaflets distributed at the Statutory Consultation stage also contained feedback on the results of the previous stage of consultation. The area consulted during Statutory Consultation will be sent a letter telling them the final outcome of the consultation.
