 $^{^1}$ Nursery school is a school in its own right, with most children aged 3 to 5. Sessions normally run for 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 3 hours in the morning and/or afternoon.

² Nursery class attached to a primary or infants' school is often a separate unit within the school, with those in the nursery class aged 3 or 4. Sessions normally run for 2½ to 3 hours in the morning and/or afternoon.

³ Special day school/nursery or unit for children with special educational needs is a nursery, school or unit for children with special educational needs.

⁴ Day nursery runs for the whole working day and may be closed for a few weeks in summer, if at all. This may be run by employers, private companies, community/voluntary group or the Local Authority, and can take children who are a few months to 5-years-old.

⁵ The term 'pre-school' is commonly used to describe many types of nursery education. For the purposes of this survey, preschool is used to describe a type of playgroup. This service is often run by a community/voluntary group, parents themselves, or privately. Fees are usually charged, with sessions of up to 4 hours.
