Subject: Haringey's Core Strategy Pinkham Way Land Use Redesignation

Dear Sir or Madam

Having read the Haringey Core Strategy proposal to redesignate the land use status of the Pinkham Way site, I am concerned about some of the apparent inconsistencies in the document. Firstly, how can the proposed use of the site as a massive waste processing plant possibly help with the provision of small and medium sized enterprises and micro businesses which have 'strong ties to the local area'? I am further confused by the fact that Haringey seems to consider that a site located next to a children's park and playground is especially suitable for industrial use. I would have thought the best place for a waste management plant would be far from schools, playgrounds and housing, such as the site of the existing facility in Edmonton which is not situated in a residential area. The building of a waste management plant on the Pinkham Way site would blight an already economically disadvantaged area and I do not understand how such a proposal can possibly be justified on socio-economic or any other grounds.
