

## Objective 5:

To work with partners to prevent and reduce more serious crime, in particular youth crime and gang activity

Robbery, (1 of the MOPAC 7\* crime types)

MOPAC is the Mayor's Office for Policing And Crime

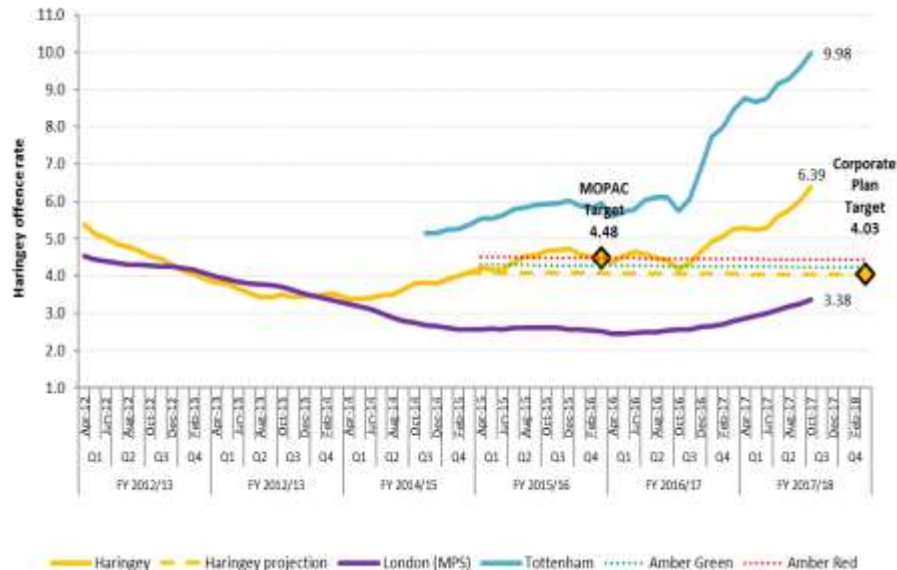


## Target:

MOPAC target is a 20% reduction by March 2016.

We plan to reduce a further 10% by 2018

Robbery offences (rolling 12 months) rate per 1,000 pop: Nov16 - Oct17



## What does the data say?

Robbery consists of both personal and business offences. Personal robbery accounts for over 9 in 10 robberies. Robbery can often be knife-enabled.

### Haringey – Year to October 17 (see chart)

There were 1,780 robbery offences in Haringey, a significant 55.9% increase (+638) greater than the 33.8% London rise for the same period. Haringey's rate of 6.39 per 1,000 pop. is consistently higher than London (3.38) but significantly less than Tottenham's rate of 9.98. Forecast set to miss March 2018 target of 4.03

### Tottenham – Year to October 17 (see chart)

There were 1,157 robbery offences in Tottenham, a significant increase of 62% (+443) offences compared to last year. Three Tottenham wards – Tottenham Green (253), Tottenham Hale (234) and Northumberland Park (153) are ranked highest in the borough.

Haringey is prone to greater fluctuations in robberies than some other boroughs with several offences occurring around the transport hubs of Seven Sisters and Turnpike Lane.

### Latest Haringey data – Year to 14 December 2017

There were 1,805 robberies, a significant 43.1% increase on the previous year. Personal robbery recorded a similar increase of 44.3% to 1,700 for the same period
