6. National, London and local policy all agree retail should be focused in town centres - more sustainable and equal (issue of good and energy efficient access). It is also clear that the existing out of centre retail park close to Pinkham has poor access and is not performing well. Neither Haringey, Barnet nor Enfield are proposing a new town centre in this location and consultation with local people through their local plans has shown no desire or support for this. Any out of centre retail application would draw investment out of existing and agreed town centres where communities and local planning authorities are working hard to retain viability and vibrancy - eg the Mayor has recently launched a £50m fund to support the vitality of existing town centres – not out of town centres.
