Welcome to the latest edition of our newsletter to keep you informed about the work Haringey Council and our partners are doing together with local residents to improve Turnpike Lane and help residents, businesses and visitors feel safe and confident in the area.

Making Turnpike Lane Safer

The Wood Green Town Centre policing team continues to tackle issues that matter most to to the local community by providing high visibility policing and strengthening partnerships with businesses and local communities to reduce violence and tackle anti-social behaviour. Some of the calls and incidents handled by the team on Wood Green High Road and Turnpike Lane include:

→ Whilst on patrols in the Turnpike Lane area Town Centre Team officers spotted a male acting suspiciously. On approach he ran off and was chased and caught. He was found with a machete in his possession, and a quantity of class A & B drugs. He was arrested and interviewed and issued with a notice banning him from the Turnpike Lane/Wood Green area.



- → As a result of community complaints Town Centre Team officers, working with partners from Transport for London and British Transport Police, carried out a series of operations around Turnpike Lane Tube Station using drugs dogs and knife arches.
- → Police dog Elvis helped officers stop a male found to be in possession of a lock knife, as well as uncover people coming to the area to use class A & B drugs.





→ Officers have carried out patrols along Carlingford Road, where residents have reported an increase in drug use. Town Centre Team officers held a community meeting with the local councillors, residents and local authority around designing out crime and increasing patrols.

MAKING A DIFFERENCE

Since the inception of the Town Centre Team in Wood Green in December 2021 they have developed good working relationships with local businesses and the community. Below are some of the key figures on the effect that the team have had on crime in the area:

- → 27 Community Protection Warnings and notices issued
- → 62 arrests
- → 342 stop and searches
- → 25% decrease in violence against women and girls crimes

- → 16% decrease in hate crimes
- → 4% decrease in all crime
- → 4% increase in drug offences, highlighting the team's ability to detect these crimes through effective stop and search
- → 7% decrease in violent crime

RAMADAN ON TURNPIKE LANE

The Turnpike Lane Traders Association (TPLTA), supported by Haringey Council, brought traders together to support the design and installation of colourful lamp post Ramadan banners on Turnpike Lane. Each of the 23 banners were supported by a Turnpike Lane business and the LICS Mosque on Wightman Road. The banners celebrated Ramadan and Turnpike Lane as a place for the community to come together to eat, shop and connect.





RESIDENTS WELCOME NEW ALLEY GATES

Residents are benefitting from new alley gates in locations around the Turnpike Lane area that previously suffered from illegal waste dumping and antisocial behaviour. The new gates were installed after Haringey Council secured funding from the Home Office's Safer Streets Fund.

One resident said; "The gate has brought a lot of smiles to a lot of local people!", while a local business representative said: "The new gate that was fitted has completely changed the area. The road is cleaner, the residents feel safer and we are once again a united community."

(RE)IMAGINE WOOD GREEN

The library alleyway wall and cycle stands at Ducketts Common have had a make-over through the (REImagine Wood Green project,



in which creatives were asked to 'reimagine' these day-to-day spaces.

The artists were selected by a community panel and supported to deliver their installations by Tottenham based art and design specialists, Bud Studio.

The library wall mural by artist Anna Nicolo is a tribute to books and local diversity and features the word 'library' written in several languages.

The artwork for the cycle stands outside Duckett's Common was designed by Eloisa Henderson-Figueroa.

The final installation on the lighting columns along Lymington Avenue by artist May Glen will be completed soon.

"The idea behind the shutter for Kaya Tailoring was to incorporate elements from the shop that were iconic pieces like the scissors, the bobbins and pins. They could be recognisable and show people what the shop was known for. Nafiz the owner wanted it to be bold and bright," Eloise Henderson-Figueroa.

"I love to paint with vibrant colours, particularly in urban spaces where I feel they will have a strong and uplifting impact. For Paradise's shutter, Yasar the owner asked that I take some inspiration from Pakistani art trucks, which are heavily patterned and very colourful," Frankie Strand.

Bringing Unity Back into the Community (BUBIC)

Engaging with local drug-users through peer-led outreach, BUBIC is Haringey's peer-led substance misuse service. Made up of people whose lives have been affected by drug misuse, BUBIC travel to drug-use hotspots across the borough for twice-monthly night outreach sessions.

They focus on engaging with those who are using illegal drugs and are not accessing free local treatments, as well as offering substance misuse advice and information to all residents.
