## Statutory Notification

### Proposed creation of three new Controlled Parking Zones (CPZs) from the existing Finsbury Park CPZ

Dear Resident or Trader,

Last November/December we carried out a review of parking in the Finsbury Park and Finsbury Park 'A' CPZs. I would like to thank all of you who responded to the consultation and gave us valuable feedback.

The general feedback from respondents of the Finsbury Park CPZ indicated that most people find the existing controls satisfactory, although signing and information regarding match and event day controls was an issue. The feedback also highlighted issues surrounding intra-CPZ commuter parking and the locations and designations of bays within the CPZ. To seek to address the main issues identified during the review process we now propose creating three new CPZs from the existing Finsbury Park CPZ. The new zones will be split as follows:

**Finsbury Park CPZ:** Woodstock Road, Perth Road, Ennis Road, Oxford Road

**Finsbury Park 'B' CPZ:** Connaught Road, Dagmar Road, Oakfield Road, Cornwall Road, Carlton Road, Beatrice Road, Lancaster Road, Upper Tollington Park (between Oakfield Road and half-way between its junctions with Lancaster Road and Florence Road), Scarborough Road and Carlisle Road.

**Finsbury Park 'C' CPZ:** Stapleton Hall Road (between Stroud Green Road and Lancaster Road), Mount Pleasant Crescent, Albert Road, Lorne Road, Marquis Road, Osborne Road, Upper Tollington Park (between Stroud Green Road and half-way between its junctions with Lancaster Road and Florence Road), Florence Road, Victoria Road, Victoria Terrace.

The current operational hours, Monday – Saturday, 8.30am – 6.30pm and 12pm – 4.30pm on Sundays and bank holidays on match days and event days, will not be affected. Resident permits will be specific to one zone and not valid for parking in the other zones.

We will also be amending the location and designation of a number of bays in the above zones to better suit the needs of the community. Plans will be available for inspection at our offices and on our website.

This notification letter marks the start of a three week period in which we invite views and comments on the proposal. This notification is part of a formal legal process whereby public notices are advertised in the London Gazette and local press, as well as being displayed in the local area. The closing date for comments is 26 May 2011.

You should note that statutory notification differs from public consultation in that any interested party can make representations, rather than restricting the consultation to a specified area.

Responses are also analysed according to the comments made, rather than based on “Yes/No” responses.

Whether you are in favour of or object to the proposal it is important that you ‘have your say’ and tell us what you think. The Council will decide the way forward after reviewing all feedback and representations. We anticipate that work on site will start in September/October 2011.
