

**Area Priorities Consultation Findings:**  
**St Ann's & Harringay**

From 21 September – 21 October 2011 an online and paper consultation took place to capture resident's priorities in the St Ann's and Harringay areas.

Residents were given a list of issues that had been identified in consultations undertaken in recent years and were asked to pick the 4 most important issues to them:

Overview of priorities:

- Residents engagement in decision making and shaping local services
- People taking responsibility for each other and respecting each other
- Cleaner streets
- Supporting young people into education and training
- Increasing the number of local people into work
- Crime, e.g. burglary and vehicle crime
- Healthy living initiatives
- Improve services & activities for older people and vulnerable people
- Development of St Ann's Hospital site
- Anti-social behaviour (e.g. verbal abuse/harassment/misuse of public space)
- Business engagement (e.g. compliance with licensing)
- Houses in multiple occupation (e.g. overcrowding/poor management)

Results:

Out of the 40 respondents in <b>St. Ann's &amp; Harringay</b> the following priorities were highlighted in order of frequency:	
HOUSES IN MULTIPLE OCCUPATION	Total = 22
ENGAGEMENT IN DECISION MAKING & SHAPING LOCAL SERVICES	Total = 21
SUPPORTING YOUNG PEOPLE IN EDUCATION & TRAINING	Total = 20
CLEANER STREETS	Total = 15

## **Additional Priorities**

In addition, residents were asked to comment on priorities they felt were missing from the list provided. 55% (22 of 40) of respondents provided additional priorities, as follows:

### Urban Environment:

- Uneven and hazardous pavements in Green Lanes
- Enforcement of planning regulations
- An improved physical environment with more trees, and green space.
- Obsolete toad traffic signs
- Excessive number of estate agents' boards
- Plant more trees

### Health

- Mobile phone masts health risk

### Housing:

- Improving the sustainability of the area, particularly housing
- Encourage more home ownership
- Knock down the tower blocks

### Safe parks and open spaces:

- Safe parks and open spaces with more facilities

### Services for families:

- Support for young people who lack positive parenting
- Services for pre-school and school aged children
- Access to family childcare

### Services for young people:

- Inspire and encourage young people when they leave school

### Traffic Management:

- Enforcement of HGV traffic regulations
- Tackle traffic in Green Lane
- Reduce high parking charges

Community Cohesion:

- Support residents to access council facilities in order to achieve community and/or individual needs and goals
