## Statutory Notification

### St Ann's Road N15: Improved Facilities for Pedestrians and Cyclists

Dear Resident or Trader,

I am pleased to inform you that the Council has secured funding from Transport for London for road safety improvements on St Ann's Road as part of London's 'Greenways' initiative. These are designed to reduce the speed of vehicular traffic and provide safer and more visible crossing points for pedestrians and cyclists.

The improvements include constructing a raised mini roundabout, and a shared use pedestrian and cycle crossing on St Ann's Road at its junction with Hermitage Road. Additionally, the existing raised zebra on St Ann's Road near North Grove will be replaced with a raised zebra crossing on St Ann's Road near the junction of Avenue Road.

The full range of measures are listed below and illustrated on the attached plan:

- Constructing a raised mini roundabout at the junction of St Ann's Road and Hermitage Road
- Introducing a raised shared use cycle/pedestrian crossing on St Ann's Road west of the mini roundabout
- Introducing a raised zebra crossing on St Ann's Road near Hermitage Road which will replace the existing zebra crossing near the junction with North Grove
- Widening the existing zebra crossing on Hermitage Road to accommodate shared pedestrian and cycle use
- Extend the pavement to reduce the width of the road to make it quicker and easier to cross
- Providing anti-skid road surface on the approach to the zebra crossing
- Removing the centre barrier on North Grove and lay shared use block paving and introduce four trees
- Existing guardrails will be amended to suit the new layout
- Introduce no waiting and loading at any time parking restrictions on St Ann's Road and North Grove
