Admission Policy for 2007/2008

St Paul's and All Hallows' C of E Infant School

The Governing Body is responsible for the admission of pupils to St Paul's and All Hallows' Church of England Infants School and admits 60 pupils to the reception class each September. This admission limit has been agreed between the Governing Body and the Local Education Authority and applies to the year 2007.

The school does not have any specific units or facilities for pupils with particular special needs and there are no specific facilities for pupils with physical disabilities. The School is however on a level site, and all the accommodation is on one floor. As far as possible, the school will ensure that pupils with disabilities have access to the same opportunities as other pupils. The Governing body is required to abide by the maximum limits for infant classes (5, 6 and 7 year olds) i.e., 30 pupils per class.

When there are more applications than there are places available, the governors will admit pupils according to the following criteria, in order of priority:

1. Children from practising Anglican families who regularly worship at either St Paul's or All Hallows' Parish Churches, Tottenham.
2. Children from practising Anglican families who regularly worship at any Anglican Church.
3. Children whose families are regular worshippers of another Christian denomination as recognised by the CTBI/EA¹

(Regularly means more often than not and for at least the past six months)

4. Baptised children from non-practising Anglican families:
 - (a) those who live within the parish boundaries of St Paul's and All Hallows'.
 - (b) those who live elsewhere.
5. Children whose families are committed members of another religious faith.
6. Governors reserve the right to give priority to children with documented social or medical reasons and those in care – if this is the nearest school or most suitable for reasons given. Written evidence should be supplied at the time of application from the relevant LEA.
