

Super Output Areas

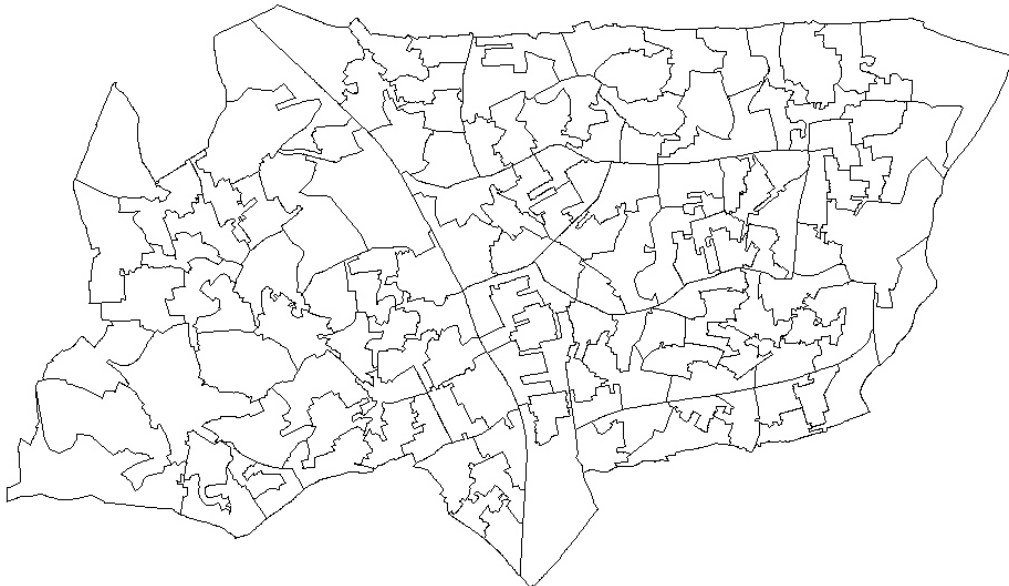
Neighbourhood Statistics are moving away from ward-based statistics to a more stable and equitable statistical geography that is based on Census Output Areas. These have been aggregated into "Super Output Areas", of which there will be **three** different levels:

- SOA1 - comprising a target population of 1,500 people, and which have been determined by the Office for National Statistics (ONS). These are the building blocks for the other two levels of SOAs. There are a total of 144 SOA1s in Haringey. **It at this geographical level that the ID 2004 is based on.**
- SOA2 - the geography which the local authority was able to determine, within the design requirements of having a minimum of 2,000 households AND 5,000 persons (but with a preferred target of 7,500 persons), built from the building blocks of SOA. There are a total of 36 SOA2s in Haringey
- SOA3 - this geography is planned with a minimum population of 25,000. This geography has yet to be determined.

The SOA1 geography "nests" within existing wards. This was a design requirement that was requested by local authority representatives. The data underpinning the SOA1 will be used to estimate ward data for the future, with statistics being modelled to deal with changes in ward boundaries or divisions/aggregations of the SOA1 geography.

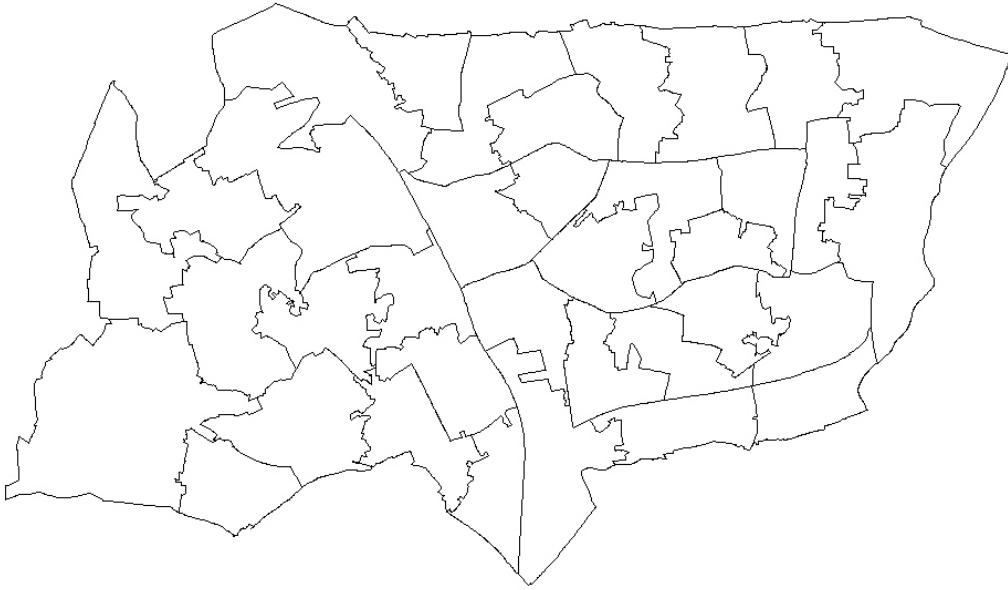
