## HARINGEY COUNCIL – PUBLIC NOTICE PROPOSED PROHIBITION OF MOTOR VEHICLES – VARIOUS ROADS, TOTTENHAM STADIUM N17

### The Haringey (Moving Traffic Restrictions) (No. 16) Traffic Order 2022 T25

**Notice is hereby given** that the Council of the London Borough of Haringey on 12<sup>th</sup> August 2022 has made the above mentioned Orders under sections 6, 22C, 22D and 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.

**The general effect of the Order:** To prohibit motor vehicles from entering the following roads in the London Borough of Haringey during specified times depending on the type of Major Event being held at Tottenham Hotspur Stadium. These locations will be enforced with a combination of Hostile Vehicle Mitigation, rising bollards and Traffic Management vehicle (Footways at locations no. 1 to 8 will also be closed).

*“Major Event” means a Football or Rugby, NFL game or Concert event which is planned to take place or which is taking place at Tottenham Hotspur Stadium, with an expected attendance of 10,000 persons or more, not including any staff or contractors engaged in either the operation or management of the aforementioned Stadium or event;*

9.	Park Lane N17 – located 8 metres east of Vicarage Road N17, outside Church of St Paul The Apostle.			
10.	Worcester Avenue N17 (south) – located outside St Paul’s and All Hallows CofE Infant School access.			
11.	Worcester Avenue N17 (north) – located south of No.27 Worcester Avenue N17 outside Concert Compound.			
12.	White Hart Lane N17 – located 4 metres east of the eastern kerb of Pretoria Road N17.			
13.	Church Road N17 – located 60 metres west of its junction with High Road N17	Not applicable for these Major Events.	Up to 10 hours prior to kick off of an (NFL) Event Day to 90 mins after the final whistle	Not applicable for these Major Events.
14.	Ruskin Road N17 – located 10 metres west of its junction with High Road N17

Access will be permitted to emergency services attending incidents at Tottenham Hotspur Stadium or properties within the Tottenham Hotspur Stadium Traffic Management Zone.

**Date of operation:** The Order will come into operation on 18<sup>th</sup> August 2022.

**Application to the high court:** Any person desiring to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it does not comply with the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made there under have not been complied with in relation to the Orders may, within six weeks of the date on which the Orders were made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
