Dear Sir,

I wish to lodge my objection to the plan to redesignate the Pinkham Way Site as 'industrial' which will lower its ecological protection. I attach paragraph 9 from the Planning Policy Statement from the Deputy Prime Minister's office:

**Regional and Local Sites**

9. Sites of regional and local biodiversity and geological interest, which include Regionally

Important Geological Sites, Local Nature Reserves and Local Sites, have a fundamental role to play in meeting overall national biodiversity targets; contributing to the quality of life and the well-being of the community; and in supporting research and education. Criteria-based policies should be established in local development documents against which proposals for any development on, or affecting, such sites will be judged. These policies should be distinguished from those applied to nationally important sites.

Surely the site on Pinkham Way deserves the sort of treatment recommended above. I, for one, am anxious that it does.
