**Subject:** Pinkham way development plans  
Dear LDF,

As a resident in N10 I would like to object to the proposed development of a large waste processing plant on the woodland of Pinkham Way, adjacent to the North Circular Road. **Residents who will be affected by having this plant so close by have not been adequately consulted.** The Council has not sought to inform the residents by public notices, mail or email, there have been no public forums for discussion (as far as I know) and I haven't even seen discussion of it in the Council's free newsletter to all residents, Haringey People. We were not even told about the re-consultation currently taking place.

I object to having the designation of this site changed from employment use to industrial use (or to use more official language, employment land designations in SP8 Employment of the Core Strategy, change of land designation for DEA6 from employment land to locally significant industrial site).

Regarding the proposed development itself, I do not consider the site suitable for industrial use - previously it has been listed as green space that should be protected. Plus the extra traffic this plant will generate during construction and after when it is in use will add hugely to this already overly congested section of the North Circular Road leading to and from it. Frustrated motorists will be driven through adjacent residential areas to escape the traffic queues, leading to increased pollution and danger to pedestrians in these areas.

The site is very close to a built up residential area and local schools and to transform it into a major industrial processing plant poses major risks to the health of the residents and school children. It seems madness to deliberately put such a plant so close to young families in this day and age when we know of the dangers of industrial accidents.

In addition there is the added pollution from the trucks and the plant itself.

Please do not put this plant in Pinkham Way. This is not a major industrial area and it is extremely underhand to change it to be one without consulting the residents in a much more thorough way. We live here and we don't want it, please!
