I wish to object to the proposed redesignation of the Pinkham Way site from Employment Land to Locally Significant Industrial Land.

Planning Policy Statement 9 on Biodiversity and Geological Conservation states that:

Plan policies and planning decisions should aim to maintain, and enhance, restore or add to biodiversity and geological conservation interests. In taking decisions, local planning authorities should ensure that appropriate weight is attached to designated sites of international, national and local importance; protected species; and to biodiversity and geological interests within the wider environment.

L B Haringey does not appear to have provided any evidence to support the redesignation, and indeed earlier this year the council's own evidence strongly recommended protection of all Employment Land. The Pinkham Way site is a Grade I nature reserve and as such should continue to be protected by its current designation.
