# YOUR ESTATE MATTERS:

## Covid-19 Information & Guidance

The Covid-19 figures are going up across the UK and in Haringey and we all need to act now to protect our communities and families to help keep the virus under control. Please wear a face covering when you go out, unless you are exempt and limit the number of people that you meet socially alongside keeping your distance where possible.

Please remember to wash your hands regularly as these small measures can make a big difference and if you show any of the following signs of having COVID-19, a new cough that won't go away, a fever or change or loss of smell and taste, stay at home and book a test by calling 119.

## What is new!

- A process has been put in place to have graffiti identified and removed in a shorter time frame.
- We are working with a contractor to address the pigeon infestation, looking at prevention methods and to clean the existing mess.
- We are installing new CCTV cameras across the estate and gates at the top of the stairwells in the blocks.
- New signage will replace old signage and decoration will take place inside the communal areas of the blocks.

## Concierge Services

Our concierge staff are continuing to record and monitor communal repairs until completion alongside reporting and monitoring any anti-social-behaviour incidents that they have witnessed. They are also making calls to the vulnerable residents as part of our ongoing checks to keep the blocks and the occupants safe and secure.

## Community safety

Through our continued work in collaboration with the Council and Police on anti-social behaviour issues, we are finding ways to report, monitor and resolve incidents that have been reported. This is being done so that we can respond to what needs to be done to improve the safety of the community on the Estate.



Following conversations and request from the residents and the wider stakeholders on the Broadwater Farm Estate, we have installed a new metal gate next to the community centre. This has been done to improve the security of the area and to stop it from being used for illegal activities and as an escape route from the police. We have received positive feedback from members of the local community.

## Working together to keep the community safe!

### Section 59-Broadwater Farm Estate

The provisions of section 59 of the Police Reform Act 2002 provide police with powers to issue warnings to persons using vehicles in an anti-social manner, either on or off the road.

Homes for Haringey and council staff are working with the police to use these powers to target vehicles conducting tyre burnouts, driving recklessly on roads and footpaths, or across parks and open spaces.

We are working with the safer estates team to develop a process where upon witnessing or receiving complaints of such driving, the appropriate action can be taken.

## Employment success for a school leaver!

Shawn has worked with a 17-year-old school leaver with no previous work experience who was looking for work. They worked on building confidence for interviews and preparation support ahead of an interview.

This work helped him to gain more confidence when applying for jobs and he started a voluntary placement in the Lordship Hub Café to gain some experience for a few hours per week.

Following some actual work experience, he started seeing some responses from his applications and secured his first official interview. He was unsuccessful but used the experience to improve. After reviewing how it went, Shawn was able to secure him with another interview locally. They worked on the interview preparation before he went for the interview, he was successful and was offered the job.



**The Broadwater Farm Employment Navigator, Shawn Semper has been busy engaging with residents throughout the pandemic supporting them to access courses or employment opportunities.**

So far, the following has been achieved:

- Around 12 residents have had interviews for a new field of employment or have attended their first ever interview to date since following registration to the service
- 50% residents have been supported to access accredited courses including Health & Social Care, with the remaining 50% of residents looking to seek direct employment.
- There has been around 20% of those registered have gone back into employment within 3 months from registration.

Following Shawn Semper's engagement with a resident, he was able to register them, get them to look at their options which lead them to apply for a more senior role. His application support lead to an interview, which then resulted in a job in a senior position managing a team of their own by June.

# New Homes and wider estate improvements updates

## New Intern appointment!

**Karakusevic Carson Architects (KCA) have appointed a new paid intern from the Broadwater Farm Estate to work with the team to support community engagement and help to get residents involved in the design proposals for new homes at Northolt and Tangmere and the potential new ideas for wider Estate improvements.**

I was interested in this role, as I recognised an opportunity to be able to bridge a relationship between the residents of the Broadwater Farm community and the architects. I hope to gain invaluable skills during my time here and gain an understanding of the processes of redeveloping local communities and the positive impact it has on its residents.



## Community Design Group for Broadwater Farm

We have been successful in our recruitment to secure volunteers from different stakeholders on the estate including residents, Willow Primary School, the Residents Association, and the Health Centre for the Community Design Group. They will meet up to twice a month in the evenings virtually if meeting face to face in a Covid-19 secure manner is not possible. They will play an active role in influencing the design proposals for the new homes on the Tangmere and Northolt sites and potential wider improvements for the estate.

## New Broadwater Farm Estate Youth Action Group!

Five young residents from Broadwater Farm Estate and Haringey have successfully secured roles with Beyond the Box Consultants as Youth Event Planners for the estate. After a round of interviews the five candidates were selected for their creative ideas, experience and passion for youth and community engagement.

Shelley Rahman who joined the interview panel said, "The successful group of youth event planners showed great enthusiasm and community spirit, and a desire to make a positive change for the future in their local neighbourhood. They are such a talented bunch, bringing a range of skills and connections, plus so many ideas. I have no doubt that they will complement each other's skills and bring forward special plans to benefit the community".

## Martlesham & Rochford - Refurbishment & Strengthening Work

Homes for Haringey and Haringey Council need to undertake refurbishment works to the Martlesham and Rochford buildings. We have commissioned Ridge & Karakusevic Carson Architects to develop designs for discussion with residents.

Martlesham and Rochford are the first phase of improvement works to happen across the whole estate. We want the homes to meet the current fire safety standards. We are working with fire consultants to understand the work that will need to be completed to do this.

Fire consultants are currently surveying and assessing the existing buildings across the estate. Working with the design team, they will produce information for contractors to make changes so that the buildings meet all required legislation for fire safety.

We plan to start fire safety works ahead of the refurbishment works and we are currently assessing the existing windows, walls, and external decks, and reviewing internal materials and finishes. The aim of these works is looking to improve the safety for residents, reduce energy consumption and fuel bills and extend the life of the buildings.

## Additional Work- Installation of a new intercom system to the Hawkinge Block

We have trialled a new intercom system to the Hawkinge block following ongoing complaints and issues regarding the current door entry system. This work involved collecting all the contact numbers from residents as they will be contacted on their phone when their door number is pressed.
