Your safety comes first! Fire safety works on Broadwater Farm

There's a lot happening on your estate now, and we're excited to share some important updates with you. Your safety is our top priority, and we are committed to making your living environment even safer, with crucial fire safety improvements coming to Broadwater Farm.

What to expect

- New cross-corridor and stairwell fire doors To improve fire safety, we're installing these doors in ten blocks on the estate.
- Front entrance fire door replacement Your front entrance fire doors will be upgraded to meet the latest safety standards.
- Decorations and repairs Communal areas in the blocks will receive necessary updates, with the exception of Rochford and Martlesham, which serve as the pilot blocks for the main refurbishment programme starting next year.

Schedule

These improvements are expected to be completed by October 2024. The upgrades will not only make your estate safer but also improve the appearance of your buildings, creating a more pleasant living environment for all residents. We will keep you informed about the progress of these works, and we appreciate your cooperation during this crucial project.

New chapter for "Equality-Harmony" Mosaic

The removal of the iconic "Equality-Harmony" mural has begun. Created in 1986-87 by artist Gülsün Erbil, a former Broadwater Farm resident, it's been a symbol of our community.

Specialists from DBR, known for work on landmarks like Big Ben, are handling the restoration. Paolo Volpi, Head Conservator at DBR, shared some insights into the process: "Our main challenge was figuring out the safest way to take apart this large artwork. Using a crane, each section will be safely lifted and moved to a storage unit on the estate."

Soon, residents will be able to witness this restoration, meet the experts, and be part of this important moment. "Equality-Harmony" will continue to inspire us.

Upcoming construction works for new homes



The construction of 294 new high quality council homes is an important step on our plan to improve the estate for all residents.

To make this happen we need to carry out some necessary works opposite the former Moselle School site.

Here is what you can expect: We will be:

- Constructing a new road.
- Creating a temporary car park.
- Works will start after Christmas early in the New Year 2024.

We will be taking all precautions needed to keep residents safe and disruption to a minimum.

Safer roads for young people and parents

In response to your feedback and your request for improved safety for pupils and parents, two new zebra crossings will be installed on Adams Road, where The Brook and Willow Primary Schools are located.

We are pleased to inform you that, pending the necessary approvals, the construction of these crossings will start by March 2024. Your concerns and suggestions are driving concrete actions to make our community safer.

You said... We did.



Improving Broadwater Farm together

We continue to work together to improve our core services on Broadwater Farm based on your feedback.

You said:

Pigeons are roosting on open walkways and roof tops

We have installed brushes on the railings of the open walkways and spikes on the roofs and ledges to prevent pigeons from easily landing and roosting. We have completed initial works to the blocks on the park side of the estate.

You said:

Overgrown shrubs and bushes on the estate are affecting security

To improve residents' feeling of security, we are working with the Parks team to trim the bushes and shrubs around the Memorial Gardens. This is in addition to our ongoing gardening maintenance efforts, to make sure they are kept at a maximum height of four feet.

You said:

There's limited access to employment support

Every Wednesday, residents can have access to employment assistance from Employment Navigator Natasha at the Broadwater Farm Medical Centre. Additionally, the first Broadwater Farm Job Fair was held in early October, providing the community with more opportunities for job support.

You said:

There are limited opportunities for gardening on the estate

We have allocated one of the planters in the Debden car park for residents to grow their own flowers and produce, giving you more gardening opportunities.

You said:

We need better recycling options

We have introduced separate recycling areas under each undercroft and worked with Veolia to provide new recycling bins, as well as special pedal-operated bins for food waste, to improve recycling on the estate.

You said:

The stairs near the bin area in Stapleford need handrails

We installed a new handrail there in late July to improve safety and accessibility.


Refurbishment Consultation



Job Fair success!

In early October, Broadwater Farm hosted its own first-ever Job Fair, with a dedicated focus on helping residents find meaningful employment opportunities.

The event was a great success and connected residents with many different employment opportunities. Angel Recruitment, a specialised agency for recruiting kitchen staff in schools and the House of Parliament, confirmed four placements. Nu Group, hiring for litter picking for Winter Wonderland, recruited six residents for work trials. Fusion interviewed for a Team Leader position and identified three strong candidates from our community. Grace Care Home, a local day care centre in Tottenham, recruited residents for roles such as drivers, support workers, and kitchen staff.

Building a healthier Broadwater Farm

We are working closely with residents and local partners to host a series of events and health check-ups, aimed at improving the well-being of our community.

Together with the Moselle Community Project and with the support of OneYou Health, service that help Haringey residents with a range of health advice and support, we've organised two health sessions so far.

Over 40 people benefited from mini health checks and were connected to OneYou Health's services. One of the sessions took place at The Willows School and saw 19 people signing up and being referred to OneYou Health's health services.

If you need help or advice, then head down to one of the community surgeries at the Broadwater Farm's Medical Centre.

Repairs Surgery

Every Wednesday from 11am - 1pm. You can get updates and help to get appointments on repairs jobs which have already been reported but not completed. Turkish interpreter is available on the last Wednesday of each month.

Employment Surgery

Every Wednesday from 11am - 1pm. You can receive support on your job-seeking process. Get advice on creating a CV and cover letter, completing job application forms, and finding suitable training opportunities, and prepare for job interviews.

Your Money and Rents Surgery

The second and fourth Monday of the month between 9.30am – 1pm. If you are a tenant or leaseholders and having difficulty paying your rent or service charges the team can help. This includes support to manage your finances and look at opportunities for grants and additional welfare benefit.
