I would like to voice the strongest possible opposition to your suggestions for the redesignation of the Pinkham way site from its present designation to that of suitable for industrial use. The area around the site already suffers from pollution above legally acceptable limits. This plan would in one fell swoop remove oxygen giving plants and replace them with a polluting plant.

The loss of protection for this site will have many and far reaching effects on local ecology, losing this site is significant as the number of these protected sites shrink rapidly.

By redesignating this site as suitable for industry, opens it up for use as a waste disposal site in spite of the fact that it is totally inappropriate to place such a facility in the heart of a densely populated residential area.

It seems to me that this change of designation is a shoddy trick to try and bypass the principles behind the objections to the site and slide the the permission to go ahead through on the back of technicalities.
