**THE HARINGEY (CAR FREE DAY PLAY STREETS) (SPECIAL EVENTS) TRAFFIC ORDER 2021**


Coming into force: 19<sup>th</sup> September 2021

The Council of the London Borough of Haringey being the traffic authority for certain roads in that borough is satisfied that traffic on these roads should be prohibited by reason of a special event and in exercise of its powers under Section 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended and of all other enabling powers hereby makes the following Order.

1. This Order shall come into force on 19<sup>th</sup> September 2021 and may be cited as the Haringey (Car Free Day Play Streets) (Special Events) Traffic Order 2021.
2. During the period between 2.00 p.m. and 5.00 p.m. on 19<sup>th</sup> September 2021 and at such times as regulatory traffic signs are displayed, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed within that length of:-
  - a) Boundary Road N22, between its junction with Rusper Road and its junction with Crawley Road;
  - b) Crescent Road, N8, between its junction with Crouch End Hill (southernmost intersection) and the common boundary of Nos. 6 and 8 Crescent Road;
  - c) Kitchener Road N17 that lies between the southern boundary of No. 41 Kitchener Road and its junction with Field Road;
  - d) Landrock Road, N8, between its junction with Drylands Road and its junction with Bourne Road;
  - e) Pemberton Road, N4, its whole length;
  - f) Seaford Road, N15, between the north-western kerb-line of Roslyn Road and the eastern kerb-line of Avenue Road (including the area the around the ramp leading to Kirkton Road).
3. The prohibitions specified in article 2 above shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs or a traffic marshal.
4. Nothing in this Order shall apply to:-
  - (a) any vehicle being used in connection with the said event;
  - (b) any vehicle being used for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes;
  - (c) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform, a traffic warden, or a civil enforcement officer.
