

BREASTFEEDING HELP AND SUPPORT

CHILDCARE

There are different childcare options depending on your child's age.

Approximate age:

- Nurseries (0-5 years)
- Childminders (0+ years)
- Children's Centres (0-5 years)
- Nursery Classes within schools (3-4 years)
- Pre-schools and playgroups (2 years 6 months to 4
- Out of School childcare (5+ years) for school aged children. This runs before school, after school or during holidays

30 Hours Free Childcare

For working parents with 3 and 4-year-old children, who are working and earning at least £120 per week.

The earnings limit does not apply if you are self-employed and started your business less than 12 months ago.

You can view or download a list of our approved 30 hours free childcare providers on our 30 hours free childcare page.

You can get 30 hours free childcare at the same time as claiming Universal Credit, Tax Credits or Childcare Vouchers.

Universal Credits for Childcare

If you and any partner are working, or you're due to start work, and you're claiming Universal Credit, you can claim back up to 85% of your eligible childcare costs for children under 16.

Free for 2s - Free Early Learning for 2-year old's

Free Early Learning places of up to 15 hours per week are for some families, with 2-year-old children, claiming certain benefits and have an annual household salary of £16,190

You will need to apply to your local council. If eligible, places start the term 'after' the child's second birthday.

Note: when the Free Early Learning entitlement for 2-year olds ends, your child will move into a Free Early Education place for 3 and 4-year olds.

SCHOOLS



Primary School Admission:

All parents must apply for a reception place for their child, for admission in the September following their fourth birthday.

Haringey provides specialistic facilities and support services for children with special educational needs (SEN). These are met in mainstream schools where additional help is available. In certain cases, a special school or unit may be appropriate.

Secondary School Admission:

In the UK, statutory education continues until the age of 18

Admissions to sixth form are dealt with directly by schools or by the Haringey Sixth Form College.

If your child has a statement of Special Educational Needs or an Education Health and Care Plan: The SEN Service will write to you in September and explain the procedure for applying to secondary school.

School Travel

The cost of home to school travel is covered by Transport for London.

Children up to 18 travel free on buses with an Oyster photo card.

Children under-11 travel free on the London Underground accompanied by an adult.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

Children are entitled to receive free school meals if they, their parents or guardians receive any of the following:

- Universal Credit providing you have net earnings of less than £7,400 a year (£616.67 a month)
- Income support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Guarantee Credit element of State Pension Credit
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Child Tax Credit (providing you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190 as assessed by HMRC)

Children in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 who attend a state-funded school are entitled to free school meals but you should still make an application if you meet the eligibility criteria.

Children aged 16-18 who attend a further education funded institution (for example schools with a sixth form, academies, free schools etc.) may also apply for free school meals.

CLOTHING GRANT

Clothing Grant

If you are eligible for free school meals and your child is transferring to secondary school in September 2019, you can also apply for a one-off clothing grant of £60.

The grant must only be used to buy school clothes or shoes for your child (we may ask to see receipts as proof of purchase). The closing date for applications for children entering year 7 in September 2019 is 31 March 2020.

To qualify for a grant, you must live in Haringey and your child's date of birth must be between 1 September 2007 and 31 August 2008.

HOW TO APPLY

Apply online via My Account

If you cannot apply online you will need to download, print and complete the Free School Meals and Clothing Grant application form (PDF, 102KB).

If this is your first application you will need to provide proof of your relationship to the child and the child's date of birth. Please also read these important notes before applying.
