Dear Sir/Madam,

I wish to object to the changes made that have led to the plans for a waste management site at Pinkham way, Friern Barnet. I am a Haringey resident and live at 99 Muswell Avenue, N10 2EJ.

I have concerns about the change of designation of the Pinkham way site from employment to industrial use, and specifically to the re-designation of the site to a 'locally significant industrial site'. My objection is based on the following grounds:

I feel that there has been inadequate consultation of local people about the re-designation of the site and of the proposal to establish a major waste management complex on it. There has similarly been little attempt to inform people of the subssequent re-consultation process.

The change of the site from employment use to industrial use will have a detrimental impact on potential employment opportunities in the area. Furthermore, and perhaps most importantly, using the site for the industrial use proposed will have a very negative environmental impact on the whole area and the community which lives in it. The site is very close to - and in some places backs on to - a residential area and local schools. The noise pollution, dust and negative environmental impact caused by the trucks and the waste management plant and machinery will have a significant detrimental effect on residents and school children in the surrounding communities, with knock-on effects throughout the area.

Therefore, I strongly feel that the plans for this site should therefore be withdrawn and rethought. If some form of waste management facility has to be established in the area, it should be on a much, much smaller scale, complemented by additional smaller scale facilities at other points in the neighbouring boroughs, so that the negative and unacceptable environmental, social and employment implications of building such a huge complex on a single site so close to residential communities can be avoided.
