

Equalities profile of Haringey

The total population of the borough is 263,400 according to the 2013 Mid Year Estimates. The borough population as a whole grew by over 38,000 people since the 2001 census. Haringey is the 17th most populated borough in Greater London.

The mid year estimates are population statistics released every year. The rest of this briefing uses more detailed population figures from the 2011 Census (this is why the 2011 figure of 254,926 is stated in the rest of the tables)

Gender

There is a relatively equal gender split in Haringey, just over half of the population is female (50.5%), in line with England and London.

Age

Haringey has a relatively young population with a quarter of the population under the age of 20, and 91% of the population aged under 65 (89% London and 83% England).

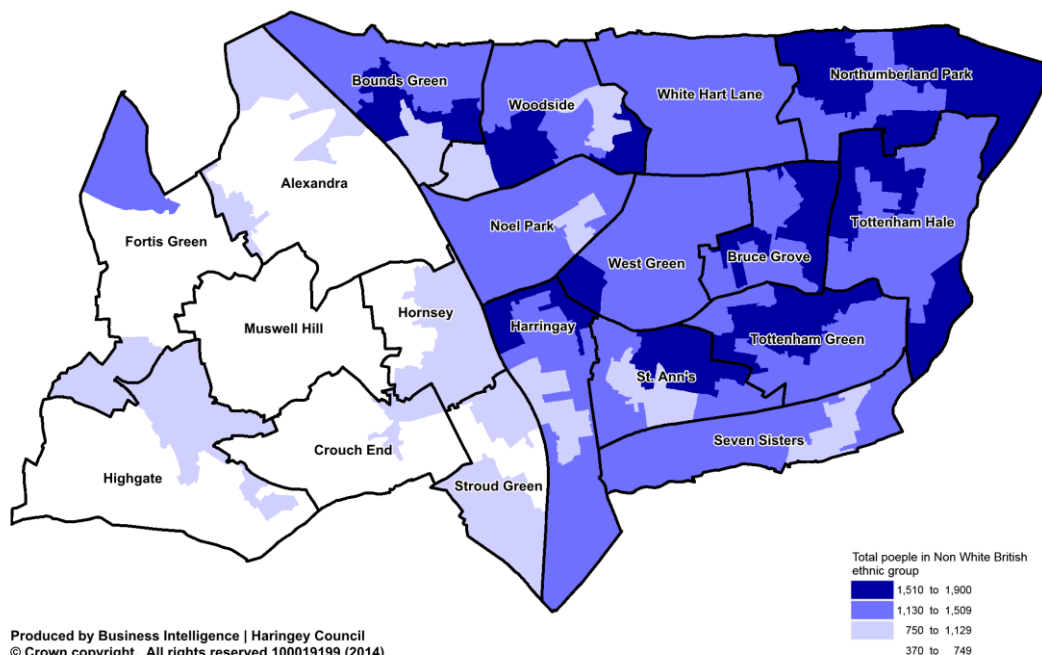
Ethnicity

Haringey is the 5th most ethnically diverse borough in the country. Over 65% of residents come from non-White British communities, compared to 20% in England, 55% for London and nearly 81% of our school children. 190 different languages are spoken in our schools. The proportion of non-White British communities varies from 35.2% in Muswell Hill to 83.4% in Northumberland Park.

Religion

Haringey is one of the most religiously diverse places in the UK. The most common religion was Christianity, accounting for 45% of residents, less than London (48.4) and less than England (59.4%). The next most common religions were Muslim (14.3%) – higher than London (12.3%) - and Jewish (3%). Haringey had a lower percentage of residents who were Hindu (1.8%) and Sikh (0.3%) than London (5.0% and 1.5%, respectively). A quarter of Haringey residents stated that they did not have a religion, higher than London (20.7%).

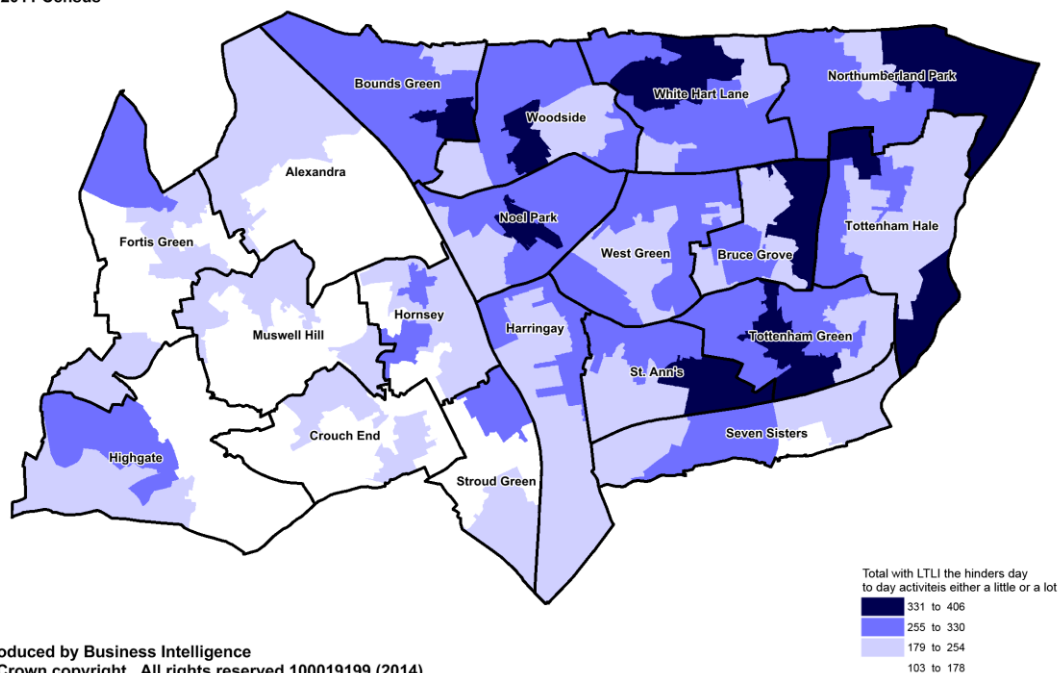
Disability

There is no universal definition of disability. Here we use the Census data on long term health problem or disability and self reported health as a proxies. This shows that 14% of residents have a long term health problem that limits their day to day activity, lower than England but in line with London. 5.7% of residents report being in bad health, slightly higher than England and London.

Sexual Orientation

3.2% of London residents aged 16 or over identified themselves as lesbian, gay or bisexual in 2013 (ONS Integrated Household Survey). In Haringey this equates to 6,491 residents.
