1 Quantity - take every opportunity to CREATE NEW AND EXPAND EXISTING parks and open spaces. Quality - make all parks and open spaces BEAUTIFUL AND INTERESTING, with a VARIETY of different characters and facilities. PLEASE - 'appearance' is not all about absence of litter and dog faeces [though those are important] and presence of close-mown lawn. NOT just about 'green' spaces and parks - IMPROVE STREETS AND IMPROVE/ CREATE SQUARES AND CIVIC SPACES. Use these as part of JOINED-UP environmental improvements to 'expand' green spaces and provide intuitive links to them. Small interventions are a product of piecemeal, drip-feed funding - fine, but they need to be part of a bigger picture or else risk being abortive, or 'lipstick on the gorilla'. [sorry, offence to gorillas unintended.] TREAT EACH NEIGHBOURHOOD STRATEGICALLY, then procure improvements which consider wider potential, context and connections. Connectivity - MAKE SURE OPEN SPACES ARE LINKED BY ATTRACTIVE, INTUITIVE ROUTES. Upgrade streets and paths on connecting routes to bring people to open spaces - this could include lighting, repaving, artworks and signage. Improve entrances. EVENTS - make sure spaces are animated by [appropriate] community and cultural events, inventive, well-organised and well-publicised. Support community organisations in organising and contributing to these, and help provide infrastructure and funding. YOUNG PEOPLE AND CHILDREN - provide more and better facilities, with the hands-on interaction of the target groups - imaginative engagement, from design right through to management, which should also provide young people with skills/ training and build confidence and a sense of ownership. Promote apprenticeships. No more 'lip service' consultation - and certainly no slave labour through unpaid and worthless internship schemes. GENUINE COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT - The above applies to all age groups! Encourage and work with community groups, eg Friends of Parks, and volunteers - but it is important these are not seen as a substitute for Council Parks services- so campaign for more resources for the Park department! Campaign to make Parks a statutory service, and for additional funding for Parks - why should some of this not come from a tiny fraction of the NHS budget, given the proven benefits of open space for physical and mental health. Consider sponsorship and private funding - but without creating 'private public' space, not truly accessible to all, or public spaces which are in effect private gardens for housing or workplace developments. Sports and play facilities in parks to be free at point of access to all in the community [except where sports provision is generous and special facilities can be rented to pre-booked groups to generate income]. On-site parks staff or wardens. And gardeners. No, I know you don't have the money, but I believe that is what everyone would like to see. Quiet/ formal gardens in all spaces, where appropriate. Quite intensively gardened areas are appreciated by many in the community and are very valuable to those in upper storey flats. Consider community gardening areas in parks, where large enough and appropriate, Public art - no 'plonk art'. Too often the last resort for a failing space - please consider first why a space is failing. Unless of the quality and regenerative potential of an Angel of the North, it will just look sad and not fulfil its purpose. All public art to be of the highest quality, Tottenham needs to be aspirational and inspirational. Interactive and ephemeral art projects with the community to be encouraged. Harness Tottenham's historical and civic built environment and exploit this in Open Space strategy - great potential for linking routes, environmental interpretation, attracting visitors and community history/ arts projects. ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR - A huge concern in many of our local spaces, and I know from conversations with local people and from other sources that it discourages positive use of spaces, and so is a downward spiral since their

absence reduces passive surveillance. Important to work with the Police's Safer Neighbourhood teams, of course - but this is not enough. Needs a co-ordinated approach to address the needs of particular 'problem' groups - including charities and social services - to try to address their issues. For instance, for street drinkers, drug users/ pushers. Any particular ethnic or cultural groups who are causing ASB issues for others need support in their own languages, and ideally meetings between different groups to understand and resolve issues. PIGEONS - May not quite register in police records, but it is a serious and controversial issue! Many people find them quite scary, and feeding them encourages rats - and destroys grass and vegetation. Others find pleasure in feeding God's creatures. We need to put our heads together and find ways to deal with this - especially in small parks where an area cannot be set aside. Are there good precedents elsewhere? Would like to see regular patrol by a hawk - might become an event, and local kids and residents might be quite intrigued!! DOGS - public awareness campaign [empower people to criticise thoughtless owners] and training for owners. [Train dogs to scare pigeons?] PUBLIC URINATION - has reached epidemic proportions in Tottenham. In parks - especially those close to streets and public places, as the parks provide a little bit of cover - but not only there - behind any tree, in any recess in the building line, and indeed sometimes just against a wall in full public view. Everybody rates this very high on their hate-list and agrees it is disgusting. Tottenham Green East suffers, in particular. [I thought residents there would be pleased to have the Christmas Tree on the East Green this year - they just said it was something else to piss behind.] The neighbourhood has no public toilets, outwith cafe and public building opening hours - but I think that is only part of the issue, as the offenders would not necessarily pay to use a public toilet. Again - what has worked elsewhere?, co-ordinated approach including working with the offending men [never seen any female perpetrator] , and public zero-tolerance campaign. [If this could include spitting, even better!] This can be a problem amongst street drinkers and particular ethnic groups who drink excessively in public spaces - but is by no means limited to them. Tottenham is seen as one open-air urinal, generally, by many born in London or who have been here for years. My profound belief is that the quality of the whole environment affects the behaviour of those who experience it, and the poor quality of Tottenham's streets and spaces has a negative impact on the health, well-being and behaviour of its residents and visitors. A start would be good cycle stands at tube station, and decent signage - but as stated above, a few Sheffield hoops, green stripes in the paving [please let's put a stop to that, so ugly] and a cycle sign are no substitute for an attractive, intuitive and imaginatively signed route for pedestrians and cycles alike. Please embed these routes in any present or future development masterplans for the industrial estate - surely ripe for redevelopment, although no-one would want to lose local employment completely. QUALITY OF LOCAL SPACES - Tottenham Green is being upgraded, but other places are in desperate need - ASHMOUNT ROAD PUBLIC OPEN SPACE - A blight on Tottenham - right on the High Road, at a major road junction, opposite a local shopping centre and a major supermarket. Its condition is atrocious, aesthetically, and it is scandalous that it provides nothing for the local community, in an area deficient in access to pocket and local parks. Families with young children have to go to Markfield Park - quite a distance with babies and toddlers, much further than recommended in the London Plan. Unfortunately, TfL has opted to increase the pavement on the north side of Broad Lane - a wider pavement with trees is welcomed, as is the reduced traffic on the road, but their proposals include no enhancements to the open space, or any overall 'masterplan' to look holistically at the whole area. PLEASE help local Page Green Residents' Association and other interested local residents, businesses and organisations to procure funding to improve this space and set up a Friends Group. PAGE GREEN COMMON - Valuable in terms of visual amenity, as part of a wide avenue of plane trees along this stretch of the High Road - but this benefits traffic, not residents. Could be quite easily transformed into a usable space, without losing the trees. Please support Page Green RA, as above, in helping to transform the Common into an open space of real value to the community. 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residents, police and FARA. It is a difficult space, with very poor natural surveillance. NORTHUMBERLAND PARK - Unlike the area around Seven Sisters, this is characterised by many large, late 20thC social housing estates, I believe mostly owned and run by Haringey. The area is strikingly deprived, even by Tottenham standards. Most of the open spaces on housing land are of very low quality and offer nothing to their residents in terms of amenity or recreation. The outdoor spaces give a very poor impression of the estates and those who live there. I'm very worried that all the focus through the proposed regeneration will be on new buildings and facilities, and that existing estates in Northumberland Park will become [even more of] a ghetto. Would like to see very significant funds allocated to wholesale improvement of outdoor spaces around estates, and with a genuine programme of resident involvement and wider community-building. [Please note - I don't work for Living Under One Sun, either] WEST GREEN ROAD - I believe the Council has [insufficient] funds to make some improvements? Great, but please continue to push for amended traffic movement - it is already pretty vibrant and needs much wider pavements, but is chaos and unsympathetic to pedestrians and shoppers. Something like one-way and other initiatives like local traders arranging joint deliveries/ delivering to cars by trolley to avoid [usually illegal] customer street parking? Is the upper floor of Tesco's multi-storey car park still underused? Could there be an arrangement to reduce street-level congestion? I know Gemma Aked is already working on WG Rd. and may be progressing some of these ideas? DOWNHILLS PARK and TOTTENHAM MARSHES - Thank you! Downhills is by miles the favourite park, locally, of the dog I look after sometimes. Xena [Jack Russell Terrier] gives it 5 Squirrel Ratings. The rats in Ashmount Open Space don't really compare as she is not allowed off the leash in case she runs across Broad Lane and gets killed. We both like the diversity of Downhills - rough grass under trees, big spaces for ball games, the existence of kids play facilities and cafe - and the fact that the topography allows this diversity to sit easily in one park. I like the formal garden, but note it needs more maintenance and refreshed planting and is probably suffering from cuts to Parks budgets. That's a shame - formal gardens need to look good all year. Xena never reads the 'No Dogs' sign once she's spotted a squirrel, so I only go in there to hunt her out. Self-closing gates might be better? Also, for older people with dogs, might be better to have 'dogs only on leads' and 'clean up' signs, rather than to ban dogs altogether? Not saying Downhills might not be better with some extra funds, but it is a good park! Tottenham Marshes are amazing [Xena thinks, not enough squirrels, but contents herself in vertical lift-off trying to catch insects]. CRUCIAL to ensure that they, and public access to them, are not compromised by pressure of forthcoming development under the Tottenham masterplan - or any other future plan. Proposals must be developed in genuine collaboration with the local community. IF any such development MUST go ahead, please ensure that public access arrangements are genuine, and that we do not end up with narrow waterside paths edged by development, where the public is permitted only grudgingly and people have the sense of intruding on private property.
