




What you've told us

Some of you may have talked to us before about what you'd like to see improved in Wood Green and for others this will be a new conversation.

Below, you can see a summary of resident engagement that has taken place recently and the feedback the community have given.

Resident's survey 2021

Wood Green residents are **less likely to feel safe after dark** than the Borough average.




The proportion of Wood Green residents who feel safe in the daytime is in line with the Borough average.



Wood Green residents are some of the least likely in the Borough to agree with the statement: "I feel like I'm able to influence decisions made by my local council", at only 20%.



The proportion of Wood Green residents who are **satisfied with their local area** is exactly in line with the Borough average, at 86%.



Wood Green residents are the most likely to agree with the statement "I would like to get more involved in decisions made by my local council", at 56%.



Local Plan

The Local Plan is currently being developed for Haringey. This plan will set out the vision for future development in the borough.

An online Commonplace exercise was run in 2021 to allow residents to have their say about Wood Green.

You said:

- → Many wanted public realm improvements to Wood Green centre and Turnpike Lane and better walking and cycling connections from surrounding areas.
- New development should provide a wider and more diverse range of shops and businesses, support local employment and the creative industries.
- New development should be supported by more open spaces and community infrastructure, particularly spaces for young people.
- Accessible public transport options were highlighted as important. e.g. step-free access.

- Several respondents wanted the evening economy directed towards Wood Green centre with a greater variety of activities on offer.
- Some thought that redevelopment of Council owned assets could provide more accessible civic and community spaces.
- New development should help address anti-social behaviour, safety, and help reduce littering.

The Wood Green Economy and Employment Space Study 2019

The Wood Green Economy and Employment Space Study 2019 (EESS) focussed on creating a better understanding of the current non-retail economy, its potential future growth and its spatial needs:

- → What type of premises and buildings do current businesses occupy?
- → How might this change in the future?
- → What kind of town centre environment would be beneficial to businesses?

One part of the study was a series of interviews with businesses across Wood Green, with the following key issues highlighted:

- Businesses were concerned about safety, poor image, as well as cost of business premises and the potential risk of the regeneration process causing dislocation/rent increases
- The creative and social economy are vital to Wood Green, and are often connected

Town Centre Vision

Future Wood Green BID is working with Haringey Council to collaborate with businesses, customers, residents and stakeholders to create a longer-term vision for Wood Green town centre.

The first stage of this engagement was recently completed, so we could understand how you think the town centre should evolve.

A survey was undertaken and the key themes that emerged were:



Physical Environment - Wood Green Town Centre is often described as tired, dirty and ugly, and people stated they would like to see cleaner, greener environment



Accessibility - excellent public transport facilities but vehicle dominated road creates poor pedestrian and cycle experience



Safety and security – safety was a frequently recurring theme, in particular in the evening. Crimes such as shoplifting continue to affect businesses on regular basis



Diversity in uses of high street premises – concern that the high street dominated by takeaways and phone shops, and perception that those customers with higher disposable incomes are not attracted to Wood Green.
