Repairs and Refurbishment



You Said - We Did

Over the past few months, we have actively worked to improve our core services on Broadwater Farm based on your feedback. Here's a summary of the improvements we made together:

You said:

Reporting anti-social behaviour (ASB) on the estate was challenging.

Our housing officers and ASB team run a surgery on the 2nd and 4th Wednesday of every month at the Medical Centre, providing you with an opportunity to report and discuss any concerns.

You said:

Accessing employment support was difficult.

Natasha, our Employment Navigator, holds a drop-in session every Wednesday at the Medical Centre. She can provide guidance and support to help you find employment opportunities. Natasha can also be contacted by phone or email if you can't attend a session (see BWF directory).

You said:

Communal repairs in the blocks needed attention.

Our contractor, SER, carried out a program of 300 minor communal repairs across all blocks, such as fixing broken windows, easing fire doors, and plastering damaged walls and ceilings in corridors.

You said:

There were frequent leaks in the undercrofts and between properties.

We've numbered all the parking bays to make reporting leaks in the undercrofts easier and more accurate. We're fixing leaks as they're reported. As part of the refurbishment program, we'll also repair and replace faulty pipework and connections in the undercrofts and individual flats. This work has already begun in properties that recently had kitchen and bathroom refurbishments, where we repaired faulty pipes and connections.

You said:

Some kitchens and bathrooms required upgrades.

We have installed 80 new bathrooms and 44 new kitchens in properties across the estate.

You said:

The pigeon population needed control on the estate.

Our contractors have been regularly removing pigeon nests and eggs on a monthly basis. A pigeon removal programme will take place later this summer.

You said:

Disused terraces could be better utilised.

We have collaborated with residents to set up gardening projects on the Croydon and Debden terraces. Residents in these blocks are now enjoying these transformed spaces and growing plants and vegetables. If you would like a terrace garden in your block, please contact Dionne (see BWF Directory).

You said:

Willan Road shrubs obstructed the view and safety.

The shrubs were cut down and regular litter picks are taking place. We will consider additional cuts if needed.

You said:

Play areas and benches required cleaning.

Jet washing has taken place across the estate, including the play area between Croydon and Debden. This comprehensive cleaning initiative has noticeably improved the cleanliness and appearance of the area.

Drop in to speak to a support worker or Local Area Coordinator about support around housing, childcare, benefits/financial support, social care referrals, grant applications, advocacy, education and much more.

The Coffee Mornings takes place on 1st and 3rd Monday of the month from 10am - 12pm at Broadwater Farm Medical Centre. Come along and enjoy an informal and relaxed Coffee Morning with free refreshments provided. Meet other residents and get to know your community.

Tottenham Talking/Connected Communities Open Activity Sessions

Every 2nd and 4th Monday of the month between 10am - 12pm at Broadwater Farm Medical Centre, you can come along to open activity sessions where you can enjoy crafts, painting, yoga, origami, poetry and many more activities.

Moselle Community Project

Join us for free activities every Friday (11am - 4pm) and Saturday (9am - 12pm) at Broadwater Farm Community Centre.

Community Surgeries

If you need help or advice, then head down to one of the community surgeries at the Broadwater Farm's Medical Centre.

Repairs Surgery

Every Wednesday from 11am - 1pm. You can get updates and help to get appointments on repairs jobs which have already been reported but not completed. Turkish interpreter is available on the last Wednesday of each month.

Employment Surgery

Every Wednesday from 11am - 1pm. You can receive support on your job-seeking process. Get advice on creating a CV and cover letter, completing job application forms, and finding suitable training opportunities, and prepare for job interviews.

Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) Surgery

The second and last Wednesday of the month between 11am - 1pm. You can report and get confidential advice about any ASB issues that you are concerned about from drug use or dealing, littering and vandalism, noise nuisance, hate crime, abusive language or behaviour, and fly-tipping.

Your Money and Rents Surgery

The second and fourth Monday of the month between 9.30am - 1pm. If you are a tenant or leaseholders and having difficulty paying your rent or service charges the team can help. This includes support to manage your finances and look at opportunities for grants and additional welfare benefit.
