Subject: Response - Consultation on the Former Friern Barnet Sewage site Re-designation

I am writing in response to the consultation to change the Former Friern Barnet Sewage treatment site from *EL* to *LSIS*.

The site has ecological importance – it is green – it is a Site of Importance for Nature Conservation. My understanding is that it is part of a green corridor and is ecologically rich. It makes up part of a beautiful stretch of green land that is clearly visible from many vantage points in the area. And there is such an abundance of wildlife in the area, which thrive on these linked pieces of land. It is so important both for London's future and for ecological reasons to preserve this type of land.

The re-designation does not seem to be based on evidence that would support the change. It doesn't seem to be consistent with national or regional policy. The only reason to re-designate this land seems to be to pave the way to accept the proposal for a huge MBT on the land.

I totally oppose the re-designation of land for EL and LSIS and can see no reason for it. Surely developpers should find land suitable for such developments, without having to try and change the classification of unsuitable pieces of land.
