Subject: Objection to change of designation of Pinkham Wood in relation to proposed planning application

Dear Ms.Whelehan and to whom it may concern,

You will be well aware by now of the objections by local residents to the proposed industrial waste processing plant at Pinkham Wood.

I strongly object to the proposed change of designation from EL to LSIS presumably as a result of objections raised by local residents.

This is clearly unsuitable as an industrial site, and contravenes National Policy PPS 9 which states that 'networks of natural habitats provide a valuable resource'.

There is no credible evidence to suggest a change of designation to LSIS is appropriate for this site, as opposed to Local Green Space designation.

As I understand it, Haringey Council are obliged to show evidence of alternative uses for a site of such size and significance to the borough of Haringey.

This is clearly a Site of Importance for Nature Conservation and entirely unsuitable for industrial use.

Could you clarify your perspective of the 'change of designation' suggested for Pinkham Wood?
