proposal lacks any new evidence or explanation as to why the site should be redesignated from EL to LSIS. The fact that Harringey have admitted themselves that 'pre-application discussions' have influenced the redesignation leaves a very bad taste in the mouth; especially as there appears to be no clear evidence that other more appropriate alternatives have been considered. Pinkham Wood is one of only nine Haringey sites designated Grade 1 of Borough Importance for Nature Conservation and so redesignation would mean losing the wonderful biodiversity of the site and an extremely valuable and liked resource in such a built up area.
