Access and areas examined Access was difficult and our progress was slow owing to the rough terrain caused by lumps of concrete or abandoned vehicles - often obscured by vegetation. Our observations on vegetation were limited to parts of the central, northern and eastern areas within the site.

Ash Abundant as saplings, also as young, maturing and mature trees

Aspen Locally Common, Colony regenerating well in NE corner of site with a

large number of saplings, and some mature specimens (ON 30 Apr

2011)

Bramble, native small amounts (ON 30 Apr 2011)

Bramble, garden Dominant in some areas. Early flowers on one bush

(ON 30 Apr 2011)

Cherry One small colony, trees had green fruits. (ON 30 Apr 2011)

(only a few red fruits remain 10 June 2011 ON)

Cherry-Plum One small group (ca 10 m long) of young trees, some with purplish

leaves. Prunus cerasifera var pissaridii (edible fr)

(10 June 2011 DB)

Dogwood one bush only (ON 30 Apr 2011)

Elder a few large specimens (ON 30 Apr 2011)

False Acacia one sapling – possibly seeded from a large tree locally.

Hawthorn Frequent, with all-white flowers. One near E boundary had

faint pink edges on petals. (ON 30 Apr 2011)

Hawthorn Distinct variety with deeply-coloured flowers – see photos

Lime mature ca 10 mature trees along eastern boundary Ca 2 along northern

boundary. (A Clancy 30 Apr 2011) Species not determined.

Oak, maturing, mature, very occasional, scattered, Two old specimens near

southern boundary with Golf Course (ON 30 Apr 2011)

Sycamore Probably the commonest tree with numerous maturing and mature

Some specimens had glossy leaves – probably derived from the large

numbers of aphids feeding on abaxial surface of upper leaves.

Mature / maturing multi-stemmed Sycamores grow in a line with some Ash of a smilar height / age. The line goes from TTQ 289(3) – 915(4)

to TQ 290(0) - 916(0)

Coltsfoot a small colony – leaves only (about 20 years ago here

By mid June none were seen (10 June 2011 ON)

Grasses

Rough meadow Grass Common (10 June 2011 DB)

Hairy Tare (fl) x2 plants (10 June 2011 DB)

Hedge Garlic (fr) one seen were there others??? (10 June 2011 DB)

Hemlock Occasional (30 Apr 2011 ON)

(fl) Frequent by mid June (10 June 2011 ON)

Herb Robert (fl) one only (10 June 2011 DB)

Hogweed rare, not yet in flower (30 Apr 2011)

(fl) Abundant (10 June 2011 ON)

Horse Radish (veg) Central area on "cleared track" 8 colonies

(4, 10 June 2011 ON)

Ivy covers ground on a large area shaded by mature Ash trees, little

else growing on ground

Frequent on bole of mature trees in Central / North area.

Forms dense mat on bole of some mature Sycamores in central area – possible bat roost sites perhaps? (4 June 2011 ON)

Japanese Knotweed small clumps in the centre of the site.

(30 Apr 2011, 10 June 2011 ON)

Mayweed, Scentless (one in flr) Frequent, scattered

(fl) (190 June 2011 ON)

Mayweed, Scented one specimen (10 June 2011 DB)

Mugwort Frequent most open places (4, 10 June 2011 ON)

Ox-eyed Daisies Patch of several dozen (fl) 4m x 2m Central area

(10 June 2011 DB)

Ox-tongue, Bristly occasional scattered specimens especially along bulldozer

tracks near eastern boundary (30 Apr 2011, 10 June 2011 ON)

Plantain, Ribwort (flr) frequent (30 Apr 2011, 10 June 2011 ON)

Plantain, Broad-leaved occasional (30 Apr 2011 ON)

Rosebay Willowherb (almost in fl) small group of <10

At TQ2898 – 9167 (10 June 2011 DB)

Russian Comfrey (flr) Abundant, Large patches where it is <u>dominant</u>

Occasionally, growing to a height of 1.5 m. Flowers

were visited by bees of unknown spp.

In many parts of the site to the east / central areas, it is not merely dominant, but is the <u>only species</u> growing in massed numbers (3 Apr., 4 June, 10 June 2011 ON)

Shepherd's Purse (fl, fr) Rare. Three specimens, scattered (10 June 2011 DB)

Spear Thistle one specimen only (30 Apr 2011 ON)

More found (fl) (10 June 2011 DB)

Teasel Several, near the car entrance, on a large open space

(30 Apr 2011 A. Clancy)

(fl) Abundant on rubble pile behind main entrance

Elsewhere Frequent (10 June 2011 ON)

Toadflax, Purple Occasional, (veg), (fl) one (10 June 2011 DB)

Vetch, Common (?subspp nigra?) 10 June 2011 DB)

Weld (fl) Rare Two plants, (10 June 2011 DB)

White Bryony Rare, one plant only at north boundary fence, between

roundabout and Hollickwood Park.(10 June 2011 DB)
