Birds and Butterfly survey **by Anthony Clancy, Geoff Crabtree**

Survey periods:

30 April 2011, 07:40 – 10:50 hours

05 May 2011, 10:00 – 13:00 hours

Access and areas examined Access was difficult and our progress was slow owing to the rough terrain caused by lumps of concrete or abandoned vehicles - often obscured by vegetation.

Birds (All identified by Anthony M. J. Clancy and G. Crabtree)

Some were located in trees along the boundary fence around Hollickwood Park
But most were also from within the wilderness area of the former sewage works site.
Most birds were identified by their call.

Clancy – an experienced bird surveyor - was surprised at the unusually large numbers of Warblers such as Blackcaps, both spp of Whitethroats, Willow Warblers and also Song Thrushes.
