Please receive our objection to the designation of the old Friern Barnet Sewage Works in Pinkham way site as Locally Significant Industrial Use.

Growing up In Bounds Green the site in Pinkham Way a rare open space that was habitat to a plethora of flora and wild animals that have found sanctuary at the site. I have visited the site many times as a youth in the years between 1976 and 1980 and observed firsthand the beauty and biodiversity of the space throughout from the boundary with the Muswell hill golf course and the land used by the railway has extended the boundary of this space to much more than just the space in question. Animals such as foxes, rabbits, badgers, moles as well as the diversity of birds and insects that the space sustains.

I believe that an assessment should be carried out of the current ECO system to determine its nature conservation value. It should be noted that the loss of the caveat to protect the nature conservation is a major change the protection of this site and will inevitably result in the loss of this precious, valuable and rare nature conservation site. This site is one of only nine sites designated Grade 1 of Borough Importance for nature conservation.

The 'Sustainability Appraisal' conducted by Hyder Consulting UK Ltd provided further evidence of this and points out the threat to biodiversity.

Consideration should be given to alternative designations such as Metropolitan Open Land, Local Green Space, or Green Grid cross boundary green space between Barnet Haringey and Enfield.
