


Northumberland Park Station Public Realm

Overview


Haringey Council has commissioned muf architecture/art to improve the area around Northumberland Park Station. Working together with you, the project will develop plans for new planting, street improvements and clear signposts along Park Lane to the Lee Valley Regional Park to make it easier and more pleasant to access nature and lead an active lifestyle.

The project has focused around Northumberland Park Station as residents have previously highlighted that it acts as a barrier to the nearby green space of the Lee Valley. The project will create a cleaner, safer, accessible and attractive environment around the station for residents, local businesses and visitors.

We would now like to share with you what we have learned so far and ask for your feedback on the proposals and suggested designs for the area.



We learned...



We used activities like walking and cycling to speak to a range of local people to understand the barriers you face to accessing the Lee Valley Regional Park and how you feel about green space in your area.
