Completing year 11 and embarking on your next steps is an exciting but also challenging time. You will have received a careers programme from your school to help you understand your options but these are major decisions and can seem daunting. This guide supports the advice you have already received and is designed to help you make the best post 16 choice for you. The information in this guide includes details on the A level and vocational equivalent provision available in Haringey, where to find information on other providers and sources of support and guidance, including on apprenticeships.



Haringey Post 16 Provision

We are very proud that Haringey post 16 provision at A Level is ranked in the top 20% nationally with our 2017 results being higher than the London and national average. All our schools and colleges are rated as Good or Outstanding by Ofsted. We also have a good vocational offer, ensuring that you can progress to the next level of education and training whatever your interests are. Staying in Haringey post 16 means you will benefit from top quality teaching, achieve well and be well-placed to progress to university, further education or training. Students in Haringey have access to great pastoral support allowing them to make excellent progress overall and achieve their goals.

Careers Support

There is an incredibly wide range of post 16 courses and provision in London. Schools and colleges are responsible for supporting you and your choices for your future by delivering impartial careers advice and guidance. Students join us from across Haringey and neighbouring boroughs. In the past few years, we have also accepted students from international schools who wish to be part of a successful, multicultural sixth form.

From September 2018, we have adopted a linear approach to A Levels and will no longer offer AS examinations. The vast majority of students will study for three A Levels and the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ). Students with a majority of GCSE grades 8 and 9 may choose to study a fourth A Level. Our impressive range of subjects enables students to study a range of subjects including a mix of arts, science and humanities.

Students at Highgate Wood School Sixth Form make outstanding progress from their GCSE results and are therefore able to move on to either university, an apprenticeship or work, with the vast majority progressing to university or art college, including Oxbridge and

We are a high achieving, mixed sixth form college ranked one of the top performing sixth form colleges in Haringey, owing to our strong performance for student progress. We are a small sixth form where students receive bespoke, one-to-one support and guidance, as well as outstanding teaching. Our most recent OFSTED report, dated March 2017, said:

"The inclusive sixth form promotes the idea of students obtaining the 'Edge' – 'excellence, drive, graduate and enrich' in preparation for the competitive outside world. Students receive excellent guidance through the 'personalised careers development' (PCD) programme and five external organisations offer mentoring and information. As a result, the vast majority go on to their chosen university or apprenticeship. Students have high aspirations and work very hard, utilising the facilities offered by the separate sixth form block and competing for sixth form leadership roles. Students enjoy attending school, with one describing it as 'like a family'."

We make the most of every minute and schedule in time for you to express your views, meet with professionals from an array of industries, and receive specialist careers information. In addition to your subject teachers, you are assigned a lead teacher who will guide and challenge you through your sixth form journey. Each student has an interview

St Thomas More Catholic School is a mixed, independent academy within the Cardinal Hume Academies Trust. The Catholic ethos of the school permeates all aspects of school life and focuses on spiritual development. It is an 'outstanding' school which offers academically stretching courses in a

broad range of subjects. Standards are high and students are both challenged and supported to achieve their potential, both academically and personally.

Expectations in terms of homework and additional study are high and we expect students to use their time wisely to study independently. The step between Year 11 and Year 12 is a big one and

only highly committed students will successfully make that leap. St Thomas More students are highly ambitious and go on to study a wide range of subjects at many of the best universities in the country. Students receive plenty of help, both from our university partners in London such as UCL and Kings, as well as interview training specialists. We recognise that to achieve their best students need support. We provide extra revision sessions, Saturday classes, and independent study sessions, many of which are taken with advanced university students who are specialists in their field.

Students are encouraged to become rounded individuals and are offered a range of extra-curricular opportunities. These include use of the school's gym

facilities, cooking classes, sports clubs, student-led trips, participation in the Duke of Edinburgh Award, writing and editing the sixth form magazine,

organising the sixth form dinner and dance, and sitting on the sixth form and whole school councils. Other leadership opportunities include the chance to become a school-wide prefect. This entails the performance of special duties around the school and the opportunity to represent the school at events. This offers a real advantage when applying to competitive universities.

Entry Requirements and Enrolment

All A Level and BTEC courses require a minimum of three grade 4 GCSEs as well as a grade 4 in both Maths and English GCSE. Students who have not passed their Maths or English GCSE (lower than grade 4) will be required to attend extra classes until they do. 
