Priory Park

Haringey is improving parks and green spaces across the borough. Between now and April 2006 Haringey Council will invest £1.4m in your local parks, open spaces, allotments and conservation sites as part of the Better Haringey 'Better Parks' improvement programme.

'Better Parks' builds upon the success of the four award-winning Green Flag parks the borough already has (Bruce Castle Park, Priory Park, Stationers Park and Railway Fields Local Nature Reserve).

Widespread consultation with park user groups and local people has determined priorities for improvement. The main areas identified are play and sport facilities, planted areas, pathways and fencing. Improving safety and reducing opportunities for anti social behaviour such as graffiti are also high priorities.

We will be looking at ways we can positively promote the use of your parks and green spaces and raise standards throughout the borough.

Why are we doing the works?

There are areas within Priory Park that need improving to make your visit more enjoyable. You have told us what your priorities are through Park User Surveys and local user group consultations.

Improvement priorities have also been identified through Haringey Council's Open Spaces Strategy and specific Park Management Plans that outline proposed works over a five year period.

What improvements will take place?

Pathways: To maintain the already high quality Green Flag standard, we are improving the surfaces to the pathways throughout the park.

Signage: The installation of 8 new detailed sign posts will make the Parks Heritage Trail a lot easier to follow.

In addition to these, new directional posts will also be installed. These will enable those who aren't too familiar with the Park surroundings to make their way through the Park with ease.

Who will complete the works?

Specialist contractors will be employed to carry out the works on our behalf, to a very high standard.

Will the park be closed during the improvements?

No. However works to the pathways will mean that some sections will be cordoned off for the duration of the works. Any disruption will be kept to a minimum.
