**The Haringey (Play Streets) Order (No. 2) 2019**


Coming into force: 15<sup>th</sup> August 2019

The Council of the London Borough of Haringey after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of powers conferred by section 29 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following Order: -

1. This Order shall come into force on 15<sup>th</sup> August 2019 and may be cited as the Haringey (Play Streets) Order (No. 2) 2019.
2. In this Order the expression "enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment and any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
3. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order and subject to the provisions of paragraph 4 below no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in:
  - (a) Malvern Road, N8 between the junctions with Hornsey Park Road and Alexandra Road and
  - (b) Park Ridings, N8 between the junction with Malvern Road and a point opposite the northern boundary of No. 26 Malvern Road,between the hours of 10 a.m. and 1.00 p.m. on every fourth Sunday of the month.
4. Nothing in this Order shall apply to: -
  - (a) any vehicle connected with the staging of the event;
  - (b) any vehicle that requires access to any property in a length of road specified in Article 3 above and is proceeding at a speed of no more than 5 miles per hour and accompanied by an adult in high visibility clothing;
  - (c) any vehicle being used for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes in an emergency; and
  - (d) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer.
