I am writing to object to the changes that have led to the plans for Pinkham Way, from a employment use to industrial use. (employment land designations in SP8 Employment of the Core Strategy, change of land designation for DEA6 from employment land to locally significant industrial site.)

The council failed to inform and local residents or schools regarding this change in statues. A change that has huge implications for the surrounding community.

The site has previously been listed as a green space. It is a vital green space acting as a buffer zone to one of the busiest roads in London, the North Circular. It is widely accepted that Haringey as a borough has an issue with clean air. Children have very high rates of asthma. Changing land at Pinkham Way to Industrial designation, in order to facilitate the building of a Waste Plant is unacceptable. I have children at St. Martin of Porres Primary School. Please check map to see the proximity of this school to Pinkham Way.

The anerobic digestion method proposed by NLWA for Pinkham Way, will, due to its composting methods, spread the fungus ASPERGILLUS. Doctors at the University of Manchester Hospital are seeing an increasing number of patients whose infections are not responding to medication. They have a drug resistant strain. Aspergillus causes problems if your immune system is compromised, for example with Asthma.
