**Subject:** Pinkhamway redesignation

As a Muswell Hill resident who lives nearby the planned Pinkham Way proposed waste plant I am writing to strongly object to Haringey's plan to redesignate the site as 'industrial'.

It is quite astonishing that at a time of grave concern nationally and globally about the environment Haringey is planning to redesignate one of its nine sites designated Grade 1 of Borough Importance for Nature Conservation to an industrial status thereby planning to lose this ecologically rich and valuable site with grave consequences for the environment and its residence.

I strongly object to this redesignation as it will have an enormous impact on biodiversity, noise, pollution and traffic.

I am also objecting to the redesignation for the following reasons:

- 1- it is not based on robust and clear evidence .On the contrary it points out to the threat of biodiversity to the site.
- 2-It is not consistent with national policy
- 3-It does not accord with regional policy
- 4-It is not deliverable: The LSIS designation is only deliverable if the Grade 1 Borough Importance for Nature designation is removed or substantially compromised. The Council's own additional evidence points out in relation to the Friern Barnet site in particular that any development on the site has potential to have biodiversity impacts because it is a Site of Importance for Nature Conservation (p6 of [Hyder Addendum SA](#)). The bigger the development the bigger the impact.

I hope that given the enormous outcry of the public you will put a stop to the redesignation of the site because we won't stop fighting against this preposterous idea.
