You could get a one-off payment of £500 to help towards the costs of having a child. You usually qualify for the grant if:

- you've no other children - unless you're expecting a multiple birth (eg twins)
- you get certain benefits

You must claim the grant within 11 weeks of expecting the baby or within 3 months after the birth.

Please be aware that the Support Fund is not intended to replace your benefits. If you are experiencing financial difficulties you may be eligible for:

- **JSA Hardship Payments** for sanctioned claimants, or
- **Short Term Benefit Advances (STBAs)** which are available where there is a new or repeat claim or a change of circumstances which will significantly increase the amount of benefit received.

STBAs are also subject to criteria being satisfied and are not guaranteed. If you have applied for a Short Term Benefit Advance (STBA) with the Jobcentre Plus (JCP) please ensure that you have received a response from them before applying to the Support Fund.

### Budgeting Loans

A Budgeting Loan is an interest-free loan for people who have been on Income Support, income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Employment and Support Allowance (income-related), Pension Credit or payment on account of one of these benefits, for at least 26 weeks. It is intended to help spread the cost of certain one-off expenses over a longer period. The amount you get is decided by the decision maker at Jobcentre Plus.

## Energy – Gas and Electricity

### The Warm Home Discount scheme

For winter 2013 to 2014, you could get a **£135** discount on your electricity bill through the Warm Home Discount Scheme.

#### Core Group

You qualify for the discount if on the 'qualifying day' (20 July 2013) your supplier was part of the scheme, your name (or your partner's) was on the bill and you were either:

- 75 or over and getting the Guarantee Credit element of Pension Credit (even if you get Savings Credit)
- under 75 and only getting the Guarantee Credit element of Pension Credit (you won't qualify if you also get Savings Credit)

#### Broader Group

Some suppliers can offer the discount to vulnerable people (e.g. those on a low income). Each supplier has their own rules about who else (known as the 'broader group') can get this help. Check with the supplier if you meet their rules for broader group help and how to apply for it.
