Subject: Response in re re-designation of Pinkham Way

To whom it may concern:

I would like to object, within the context of the new reconsultation, on the change in designation of the Pinkham Way former Friern Barnet Sewage Treatment Works from "EL" to "LSIS".

My main objection is that the the re-consultation document (CSSD-3) contains no reasonable evidence to support the change. Indeed, given the natural environment which has developed around the site over the past few decades, it seems that there is evidence to support having no change made, or even further protection!

I would like to ask whether there other designations were even considered? I have not heard that any were. This is also a significant problem.

I would also point to the admission that 'pre-application discussions' with NLWA may have influenced the proposed change. The site designation is not a mere label that can be changed at will - it is a serious protection to natural environment which ensures no unsuitable development will be made. To change the designation, serious credible evidence is needed that the change is suitable and accords with policy (regional and national).
